Taylor Competition Report

The Atlanta AGO Chapter held the 2022 Taylor Organ Competition on Saturday, March 12, at First Presbyterian Church of Atlanta. The competition, held every three years, is for organists aged 23 and younger who either are enrolled in a school in the United States or are a legal resident of the United States. The finalists were chosen from nineteen applicants who submitted recordings that were judged by Robert Bates, Jonathan Moyer, and Carole Terry. Five finalists were invited to perform in Atlanta - Katherine Jolliff, Audrey Pickering, Adam Chlebek, Aidan Hill, and Sarah Palmer. Each finalist was required to play a prelude (or fantasy or toccata) and fugue by Bach; Liszt's transcription of Wagner's "Pilgrims' Chorus;" Fantasy on 'Prospect" by Aaron David Miller, which was commissioned by the competition committee; and a work of the performer's choice written in 1930 or later.

Ken Cowan, Janette Fishell, and Michael Unger served as the jury for the final round. Katherine Jolliff won the first prize of \$10,000 and a concert in Atlanta to take place during the chapter's 2022-23 program season. Adam Chlebek won the second prize of \$5,000. Katherine is a 19-year-old student at the Eastman School of Music, and Adam is a junior at the Oberlin Conservatory. Congratulations to all!

AVAILABLE PIPE ORGAN: Our Opus 1 (1998) is a three-manual/29-rank rebuild and enlargement of a two-manual organ installed in St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, Bridgeton, NJ originally built in (1909) by C.S. Haskell, who previously had been foreman of Hilborne Roosevelt's Philadelphia shop.

St. Andrew's recently merged with two other parishes, and its historic building has been sold. The organ is now in storage on our premises and is available for installation in a new home for \$200,000–350,000, depending on particulars. Its sound and stoplist are strongly reminiscent of American organs from the period of 1880–1915 as heard in instruments by such builders as Hook, Roosevelt, and their contemporaries. Indeed, two-thirds of its pipework dates from those years. It has five 16′ ranks, five reed ranks (including a Hook & Hastings Bell Clarinet dating from 1881), as well as four wooden flute ranks plus three metal flutes. Fourteen of the metal flue ranks are slotted. The action is electro-mechanical, and is equipped with a state-of-the-art control system.

Piano Masterworks From Beethoven to Prokofiev Matthew Manwarren, pianist


A celebrated pianist, scholar, and teacher, Dr. Manwarren comes to St. Luke's from Winthrop University, where he has served as Professor of Piano since 2006. A native of El Paso, TX, he holds degrees from Texas Tech University and the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, studying piano with Frank Weinstock and Elisabeth Pridonoff and organ with David Mulbury. He pursued post-doctoral studies in Paris at the French Institute with Dominique Merlet, Pascal Devoyon, and Noel Lee. Manwarren has also coached with Virginia Hutchings of Atlanta, Walter Hautzig of New York City, and John O'Conor of the Royal Irish Academy of Music. He was recently appointed Artistic/Executive Director of the Adamant Music School, an intensive summer school in Vermont which attracts pianists from the across the world each year.


