

## THIRD ANNUAL MLK JR. CONCERT AT ST. LUKE'S

Music by African and African-Diaspora composers will be featured at the third annual concert in honor of Martin Luther King Jr. at 4 p.m. on Sunday, April 17, at St. Luke's Church, 435 Peachtree St. in Atlanta. The concert is free to the public. The event is sponsored by the Anti-Racism Commission of the Diocese of Atlanta. Three Episcopal church choirs will be joined by the choir of the First Congregational Church, directed by Norma Raybon. The Episcopal choirs are St. Paul's, directed by Trey Clegg; St. Luke's, directed by Robert Poovey; and Holy Innocents', directed by David Brensinger. Other participants include Jamaican soprano Dawn Marie James, soprano Marva Shelton of St. Mark's Lutheran Church in College Park, and pianist Amy Hughley and organist Calvert Johnson, both of St. Bartholomew's Episcopal Church in Atlanta. Honored at the program will be Mattiwilda Dobbs, who was among the first African-American opera singers to perform at such prestigious venues as La Scala in Milan and Covent Garden in London. Representing the national church and participating in the program's proceedings will be the Rev. Jayne Oasin, the social justice officer of the Episcopal Church. #### Michael McDowell

One of our oldest members, Michael McDowell died February 14, 2005, at the age of 95. He served as dean of the chapter from 1966 until 1968.

A native of Greenville, Florida, McDowell graduated from Emory University, where he was pianist for the Emory Glee Club. He studied piano and organ in Leipzig, and received a master's degree from Harvard in 1958. He taught at the University of Georgia, and served in the Air Force. In 1950 he became chairman of the music department at Agnes Scott College, a position he held until his retirement in 1975. He served as Choir Director at Emmanuel Episcopal Church in Athens. In Atlanta, he served as Director of Music and Organist at St. Mark Methodist Church from 1950 until 1993.

In addition to his membership in the AGO chapter, McDowell was active in other musical organizations. He was a founder and first president of Georgia Music Teachers Association, a life member of the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra Board of Directors, and an active supporter of the Metropolitan Opera.

His wife of twenty-four years, the former Caro Howell, died last year. He is survived by two sisters.
