## Greetings from Our New Chaplain



Allow me to introduce myself: I am Mother Melanie Rowell, and I'm pleased to be your new Chaplain. In January 2023, I was called to be the 12th Rector of Church of Our Saviour in Atlanta, which, along with St. Columba's, is one of two self-identifying Anglo-Catholic parishes in the Episcopal Diocese of Atlanta.

Although I'm now a parish rector, prior to my graduation from the School of Theology at the University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee, and my subsequent ordination to the priesthood in 2018, I taught music and voice in various forms for over twenty-five years, eventually becoming Associate Professor of Music at Southern Wesleyan University in Central, SC. There I taught applied vocal lessons, diction, music history, and directed/conducted the yearly student musical. In addition, I maintained an active performing schedule as a professional soprano, singing recitals and oratorio as well as roles in musicals and operas.

Although this is my first time as rector, I served as Assisting Priest at St. Columba's Church in John's Creek, Georgia. Along with my work at St. Columba's, I served for over four years as Lower School Chaplain at Holy Innocents' Episcopal School. I have been a member of the Society of Catholic Priests since 2017, serving as Secretary to the Council from 2018 to October 2022. In October 2022, I was elected Provincial Convener.

I enjoy reading, hiking, walking, traveling, and listening to almost any kind of classical music, and I am a particular fan of the organ (although I do not play it myself).

It is my hope that I can serve as a pastoral resource and presence for everyone in the Atlanta AGO. I know you all have ministers and priests who are typically also your bosses, and so there may come times when you want or need confidential pastoral support outside of that. 
