

## Premiere a New Choral Work on April 6!

Our AGO Chapter has commissioned Bruce Neswick, FAGO, to compose a work for SATB choir with organ accompaniment. The composition will be first used on the fifth Sunday of Lent 2003 in the churches of our Chapter Members. The piece is intended to be technically accessible to a majority of parish choirs and organists. The text is taken from the Scriptures for April 6th of Lectionary Year B: Psalm 51 and Jeremiah 31:31-34 (NRSV). Please participate in previewing this new addition to the choral repertoire, during the intermission of the Widor Festival on Friday evening. January 24. Computer-engraved copies will be available on January 24 and 25 for each Atlanta Chapter AGO member. #### Sub-Dean's Corner

#### February Members' Recital Preview

A colorful and creative evening of organ transcriptions awaits you at our annual Members' Recital on February 11, 2003! This year's event will find us hearing and playing the three-manual Austin organ at Mount Vernon Presbyterian Church. Our host will be Jim Wingate, Organist/Choir Master at Mount Vernon.

This idea for programming was suggested at a meeting of our AGO Chapter's Executive Board. We then enlisted the helpful and enthusiastic expertise of chapter member Tom Alderman, Organist at Roswell United Methodist Church. Tom proposes the following three categories as a framework for members' participation in the program:

- 1. <u>Bach Transcriptions</u> This would include many of the favorites such as "Air on the G String", "Sheep May Safely Graze," etc., and also would include the wonderful Vivaldi transcriptions by Bach himself.
- 2. <u>Vocal Repertoire</u> This would include many of the arias and art songs that have been successfully played as instrumental solos, such as Grieg's "Ich Liebe Dich" and Schubert's "Ave Maria." It would also include many of the choral masterworks that have been played as organ solos.
- 3. <u>Orchestral Transcriptions</u> This would include the marvelous Wagner transcriptions by Edwin H. Lemare

as well as other favorites from operatic scores and symphonies.

The recital should last no more than ninety minutes. Members desiring to play should time their selection in minutes before contacting Tom Alderman.

PONDER THE POSSIBILITIES, but don't wait too long to decide! We hope to strike a relatively even balance of pieces and/or length of time among the three categories represented.

We can talk about more ideas at the Christmas Party. I'll be sporting an orthopedic shoe, following foot surgery on November 18. It must replace organ shoes and all other shoes until January.

Meanwhile, here's to an Advent with spaces able to welcome!

#### Mount Vernon Organ

The three-manual Austin organ #2490 was built in 1969. It has thirty-eight stops and thirty-four ranks, with electro-pneumatic action. The Swell and Choir are under expression. There are fourteen General Pistons, ten of which are duplicated on toe studs. There are seven pistons for each manual, and five pedal pistons with toe studs. The organ is described in *Catalogue of Pipe Organs in Georgia*, American Guild of Organists, Atlanta Chapter, 1992, pp. 150-151.


