HARRY HUFF serves as Minister of Music at Boston's historic Old South Church (UCC), where he plays the 1921 E.M. Skinner organ, Op. 308 of 115 ranks, conducts the Old South Festival Choir and supervises the church's extensive music program, which includes a jazz ministry, the Old South Ringers and numerous concerts. He is currently also Music Director and Lecturer on Ministry at the Harvard Divinity School and Chapter Organist in The Memorial Church, Harvard University. From 1984 until 2004 he was Director of Music for Calvary Episcopal Church, and from 1986 until 2004 he was Organist and Artist-in-Residence at Union Theological Seminary, both in New York City.

Mr. Huff was born in Sevierville, TN. During his studies in the 1970s at the North Carolina School of the Arts and later at Yale University, he won organ competitions sponsored by the American Guild of Organists, the Royal Canadian College of Organists, the National Society of Arts and Letters and the Music Teachers' National Association. He has been a guest artist at the Aspen, Spoleto, Mostly Mozart, Copenhagen and Avignon summer festivals, and has appeared as soloist with the Orchestra of St. Luke's, the American Composers' Orchestra, the New Jersey Symphony, the New York Pops and the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra.

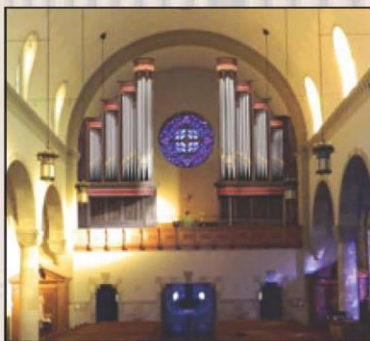
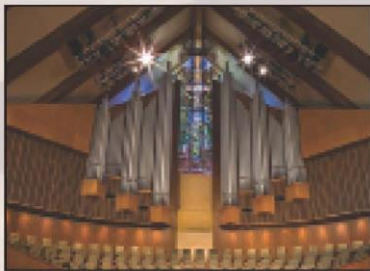
