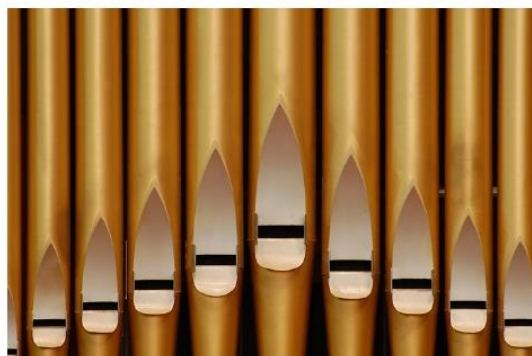

Lessons & Carols during December

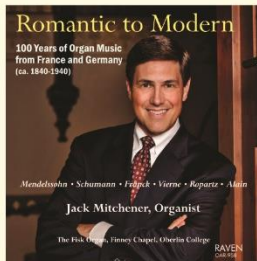

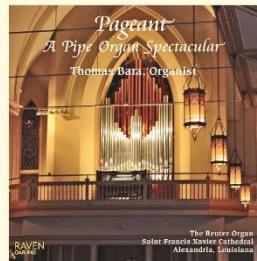

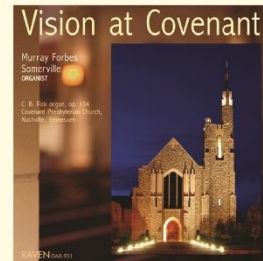
Romantic to Modern: 100 Years of Organ Music from France and Germany (c. 1840-1940)
