COME SPEND A WEEK in beautiful Scotland, seeing, hearing and playing many of the outstanding instruments of the country, built by some of the world's finest builders. We will be staying in our own private castle, with amazing countryside and comfortable accommodations. Cost is \$3,595 for AGO members (\$3,845 for non-AGO members) which includes return airfare [JFK-NYC], all castle accommodations, daily breakfast, entrance fees and donations to churches, all ground transportation, tour guide services of a former cathedral organist and historical/specification information for each instrument. There will be opportunities to play many of the instruments visited, and to hear a demonstration of the organ. Places are limited to 14 organists to allow for as much playing time as possible at each site; non-playing guests, partners and enthusiasts are welcome, up to a total of six additional people.

About the Organ

The pipe organ at Warren William's home was installed in 1998 by Phil Parkey and Associates with some recent enhancements. It is comprised of Moller and Pilcher pipework and a 3-Manual drawknob Reuter console. There are 23 ranks with 10 additional digital pedal ranks, plus a Zimbelstern.

The large music room has a twenty foot vaulted ceiling with English beams. The Great, Swell and Pedal divisions speak through grillwork from downstairs. The Choir division is located in the music room.

We would like to give the following to the Chapter to use as a door prize for the Christmas Party.

An antique hand-colored etching of Rheim's Cathedral's left transept that, oddly for a French church, contains the organ. The etching itself is in sepia ink; the color is on the clothes of a few people standing at floor level. The print is signed, but not dated, but it clearly predates destruction of the cathedral during World War I. Size is perhaps 15" x 24" framed.

IT'S EASY TO FIND — Just 4 blocks behind Phipps Plaza off Peachtree Drive North. GO PAST Lenox Square on the right and at the North Corner of Phipps Plaza, TURN LEFT on WIEUCA ROAD, just in front of (Wieuca Road Baptist Church). Stay in the right lane and go the 4th street to the right which is NORTH IVY ROAD. TURN RIGHT and go to the bottom of the hill to #4124 (on the brick mailbox). It's a large red brick English Tudor home up on a hill with a long driveway. There are about 4 parking spots at the top reserved for handicapped, otherwise, there is plenty of street parking.

If you are coming from Roswell Road in Sandy Springs, turn left on Wieuca Road and continue past the I-400 bridge overpass and take the 2nd street to the left, which is North Ivy Rd. Go to #4124 at the bottom of the hill.




