
Are you searching for a year end tax-deductible contribution? Here is one idea which will be welcomed and beneficial to all concerned.

A Note from our Chapter Treasurer

Our major source of income is the chapter portion of the dues we pay each summer. These dues support the recitals and other programs we enjoy each month. The \$12.00 you pay for dinner only reimburses the caterer which is why we send out invoices to collect for dinners not paid for. This is really the best deal in town – dinner and a show for \$12.00 per person. Sometimes we are the lucky recipients of additional support from the host churches. Please make sure you thank the host because he or she has really put a lot of effort into pulling off our program.

At October 31, 2006 we had \$308,875.35 in our Wachovia Money Market Account. The bulk of this amount (\$300,000.00) comes from a beguest from Elizabeth Abbott Taylor. These funds will be transferred out and invested with Morgan Stanley to produce an income restricted to use for scholarship awards. The Wachovia General Checking Account had a balance of \$1,537.84 as of October 31, 2006. We use this account for our expenses related to the Organizer and other miscellanous costs. We also have a balance of \$137,465.88 invested with Morgan Stanley in various funds. This amount is subject to fluctuations up and down related to the stock and bond markets. Currently with the Dow Jones index closing at record highs the balance has increased each month. These funds are also restricted to use for scholarships and commissioned works only.

A Message from The DEAN

We don't often get Christmas presents before Thanksgiving, but those of us who ventured up to Cumming First United Methodist Church on Saturday certainly received one – a lovely mixture of choral and organ music, blended with good food and warm hospitality, and all tied up neatly with a holiday ribbon!

John Hutchinson, the resident organist and director of music, confided in me several weeks before the event that he was afraid he had overbooked himself for this weekend. Over the course of a month or so, he had obligated himself to accompany the silent movie version of "Phantom of the Opera;" perform the Poulenc "Concerto for Organ, Strings, and Tympani"; and conduct a Mozart Mass – and all of this on top of the usual spiraling schedule of Advent and Christmas rehearsals and extra services! His chamber choir of a dozen singers joined us in the morning for a wonderful reading session of seasonal anthems, and following lunch, brought us into the spirit of Christmas with anthems, selections by a recorder consort, and some dynamic organ playing.

Once all of the flurry of Christmas is behind us and we are looking ahead to a more relaxed Sunday than we have had for a month, David Houston will be hosting our annual Christmas party at the Episcopal Church of the Epiphany. Part of the evening will be a celebration of a new 16' reed stop on the organ, given in honor of Bishop Gene Robinson by Bill Weaver and Doug Johnson. There will be time for members and guests to play the organ, and to sing those carols the "stricter" among us have put off singing until Christmas Day. Good food and fellowship are promised to all who attend! What a delightful way to celebrate an exceptional season of generosity from our members and excellence in musical performance!

One of our former pastors at Central Presbyterian Church always prefixed his sermon with the prayer, "O Lord, uphold me, that I may uplift Thee." I say that prayer every Sunday before I begin my opening voluntary as my own "mission statement" – even (or maybe especially, around Christmas and Easter when it is easy for us to forget why we are sitting on the bench or standing in front of the choir. May we all find time amid the "hurly-burly" of the season to remember the One whose birthday it is we celebrate, singing joyfully with Mary: "My soul doth magnify the Lord, and my spirit doth rejoice in God my Savior!"






