All finalists but one, and several non-finalists, are heard in these broadcasts. The last of the the three broadcasts relies heavily on Spivey Hall performances, concluding with Jonathan Oldengarm's performance of Calvin Hampton's Prelude and Variations on Old Hundredth, and Vincent Dubois' performance of Franz Liszt's Fantasy and Fugue on "Ad nos, ad salutarem undam."

Sub-Dean's Corner


I'M LEARNING, and I CARE! I did not expect serving you in this capacity would be so



POE News

The POE committee would like to ask each member of the Atlanta AGO chapter to think of at least one potential POE student---could be from church, piano studio, friends, etc...Make an effort to give that student (or their parents) a personal invitation to apply for the POE. Tell them that the brochure will be printed in January and will contain an application. The fee is \$300 for the entire week (June 20-25) which includes tuition, room, board, private lessons Monday-Thursday and all activities.

One POE committee member mentioned the upcoming POE after a recent choir rehearsal, and three scholarships were promised. You can encourage <u>your</u> church to sponsor a student for the POE, or supplement their tuition with a love offering, etc... Ask to put a statement in your church's newsletter about the POE or have it announced at church. Remind clergy and lay persons that this is one way that they can help to ensure that there will be a supply of organists to play their church organs in the future.

Our-oftown faculty members include Alan Morrison, of Curtis Institute of Music, Philadelphia, Paul Jacobs of the Juilliard School, New York, Dr. Laura Ellis of the University of Florida, Gainesville, FL., and Anthony A. 

Editor's Note

Since September of 2003, we have been sending *The Organizer* by e-mail to all members who have e-mail addresses, and a printed copy to everyone. Beginning with the January issue, the duplication has been discontinued. If you have an e-mail address, you received the printed copy ONLY if you have contacted me and

requested it because of technical difficulties. As usual, we discovered that the change was not as easy as we had hoped. Right away we discovered that those of us with dial-up Internet connections received *The Organizer* as an e-mail attachment very slowly. We have tried to reduce the file size, and it has helped speed things up. We found that things go much faster if you download *The Organizer* from the chapter website, www.agoatlanta.org. Another reason for using this method is that YOU can choose the time to download, and are not held captive when the e-mail with a big attachment comes at an inconvenient time.

Here are some reminders:

1) We must have your correct e-mail address. If you change providers, or if your e-mail is incorrect in the yearbook, please send us the correct address. This helps me, and it also helps Dave Barber, who handles the e-mail dinner reservations.

2) You must have Adobe Acrobat Reader, version 5 or higher, installed on your computer. It's free!

3) You must be patient while the PDF file downloads. This takes a few minutes (honest!), and you may think that nothing is happening. You won't see anything on the screen until the entire file has been downloaded. I found that I can download from the website in about three minutes, while it takes twenty to thirty minutes to send or receive the same file as an e-mail attachment.
