Bradley Welch

A native of Knoxville, TN, Bradley Hunter Welch began playing the piano at age 10 and organ at age 13. Bradley attended Baylor University in Waco, TX and studied organ with Joyce Jones and piano with Jane Abbott-Kirk. In May 1997, he received the Bachelor of Music degree magna cum laude in Organ Performance as well as winning the Dean's Award for Outstanding Performance.

After Baylor, Bradley continued his studies at Yale University where he studied with Thomas Murray and Martin Jean. In May 1999, he completed his Master of Music degree in Organ Performance at the Yale University School of Music/Institute of Sacred Music. Bradley then continued at Yale to earn the Artist Diploma in May 2000, at which time he was

awarded the Horatio Parker Memorial Prize, the most prestigious prize awarded by the Yale faculty. In May 2001, he completed the Master of Musical Arts degree, which signifies that he has completed all the classwork for Yale's Doctor of Musical Arts degree. During his time at Yale, he also received the Robert Baker Prize (given to an incoming organ student who is deemed to be in the top 1-2% of the nation's young organists), the Charles Ives Prize, and the Yale School of Music Alumni Association Prize.

In addition to his studies, Bradley has competed in several competitions. He won First Place in the Undergraduate Division of the 1994 William Hall Organ Competition in San Antonio, TX. In 1995, Bradley was a National Finalist in the Organ Division of the Music Teachers National Association Competition. In July of that same year, he won First Place in the American Guild of Organists Region VII Competition for Young Organists. He is the 2003 First Place winner of



What is a **LISTSERV** and what is **AGOAtlanta-L?** A **LISTSERV** is an electronic mail facility which allows you to participate in an electronic discussion group on topics of interest related to our membership. The Beginners Very Brief Guide to Using the AGOAtlanta-L email Listserv

1. Email address for posting messages to the AGOAtlanta-L list: AGOAtlanta-L@listserv.uga.edu

[not case sensitive ; NOTE: there is no "E" at the end of LISTSERV]

2. The list is set up to automatically reply to the original sender of a message, otherwise everyone on the list would receive answers to a personal query and clutter up their mailboxes. With the variety of available email clients in cyberspace, please consider the following:

a. If someone is asking for information for personal use, respond directly to that individual - please verify your response is NOT going to the list.

b. If the person requesting the information feels the answers would be of interest to the chapter at large, offer to 'summarize' the responses in a follow-up email.

3. The list is currently set up to allow attachments to be sent with your email - Word.doc documents, PDF files, picture files, etc. Note that some members email clients might not accept attachments, so include contact information in the body of your email.

4. Please sign your emails with your name, and include a contact phone number, snail-mail address, name of your church/institution, etc. (Many won't always have their Chapter Handbook right at hand to look you up)

5. a. If you use more than one email address and wish to be able to send messages to the list, BOTH addresses need to be registered:

b. If your email address will change IN ANY WAY please notify: William Coscarelli: <u>wfcmusic@uga.edu</u> and <u>wcoscarelli@charter.net</u> David Barber: <u>d_barber@bellsouth.net</u>

8. Currently new members will be added to the list by contacting William Coscarelli or David Barber at the above addresses. As we monitor the activity on the list for a while it may become possible for individuals to subscribe independently.

9. If you will be going on vacation or you have multiple email addresses registered and would like only your primary email client to receive messages, follow these steps:

a. Open a blank email - leave the subject line blank

- b. Address it to: <u>LISTSERV@UGA.EDU</u> [not case sensitive]
- c. Type the following line exactly into in the body of the text:

set AGOATLANTA-L nomail

[do not include any signature information -- only the above line of text]

d. Send the message - and confirm **no subject** [if you are prompted to reply]

e. To reactivate your account, follow steps a-b and type the following line in the body of your message:

set AGOATLANTA-L mail

[again, do not include any signature information -- only the above line of text]
