THE ROAD NOT TAKEN

from Tim Young, 5P

In the world of church pipe organs there are generally three types of instruments,

- 1) in good repair and a joy to play;
- 2) somewhere in between and better than nothing to play; or
- 3) ready for the scrap heap and a chore to play. The majority of times, when an organ is in need of serious repairs, it is entirely replaced with a new one. By the mid 90's Holy Trinity's organ fell between categories two and three. Purchased in the late 1970's before the present church building was built, the organ was bought from a congregation in Missouri. A full history is available on the church web site: www.holytrinitymarietta.org

When I arrived at Holy Trinity, the first Sunday of Lent in 1997, I found a vibrant growing community of 1400 faithful members, a strong music program, an enthusiastic singing congregation, and a varied liturgy. The second hand, relocated organ was the key supporter but was struggling to keep up with demands and had become unreliable. If interested, a complete history of the organ is available at out web-site.

The organ console, located behind the choir, was poorly placed. Tonally the organ was dark, and scaled too large for the room capacity. Mechanically, many parts didn't work or did so intermittently. I lived with the organ for a year. I loved the job, the staff and the congregation but found the organ difficult to work with. What to do?

I'd been there long enough by that point to know a new instrument was out of the question. No major donor was available and there was strong sentimental attachment to the old organ. So, rather than consider a totally new instrument, we took the road less traveled and decided to save the best of the pipe work and developed a systematic plan of repairs and improvements to be implemented as funds became available.

Along the road a new console was added, 80% of the "bones" or mechanical systems were repaired or replace, new principal and reed choruses replaced old, the total specification was filled out, and smaller strings and flutes were revoiced. The room also got a much needed makeover including a new hard surface floor. This was a major battle that delayed the project while we educated the congregation and council to the importance of hard surfaces to not only enhance great organ and choir music but to, more importantly, allow the congregation to worship as a community with the ability to hear one another sing and speak as a

corporate identity. Finally, a new "skin" in the form of a creatively designed new facade enhances our simple sanctuary with a new craftsmen style design direction.

The results are wonderful and I'm now pleased to share with you an organ of beauty, warmth and presence. We've been back in the room for two months now and folks are still raving about the improvements to the organ and how exciting it is to hear each other sing. In fact, plans are now being developed to renew the remainder of the building.

It has been a long 10 years, but our achievement will last 10 times that long. I encourage you to develop a vision for the instrument on which you work. Make the most beautiful music you can with what ever you play, in what ever condition it is in. Develop support within your congregation for your vision and then go for it! The results will enliven your congregation and leave a legacy for generations to come.
