Timothy Albrecht is Professor of Music and University Organist at Emory University in Atlanta, where he heads the graduate organ degree program. He concertizes extensively and gives masterclasses throughout the United States and Europe. Born in Minneapolis, Timothy Albrecht moved to Los Angeles and Milwaukee, where he first studied piano with east-European emigrant, Eugenia Prekosh. He earned two undergraduate degrees from Oberlin and his doctorate from the Eastman School of Music. Currently Augsburg Fortress publishes eleven volumes of his hymn-based organ compositions entitled *Grace Notes*, Volumes I-XI.

The Fishburne Parking Deck (1672 North Decatur Road, Atlanta, 30322) is ideal and free (after 4PM). The Fishburne Deck located on the same side of the street as the church. Fishburne is the building directly between Glenn Memorial UMC, 1660 N. Decatur Road (the site of our dinner is the lower level Glenn Fellowship Hall in the Glenn Church School Building, which is directly next to Fishburne) and the Schwartz Center Emerson Hall, 1700 N. Decatur Road (the site of the 8 PM recital).

Members of the Atlanta Chapter of the American Guild of Organists are invited to sit in the organ loft during the recital, as well as play the Jaekel Op. 45 instrument at the conclusion of the recital.
