From the Dean

As you read this column, we will have completed the Christmas Season preparation and events for the Year 2003. A busy time for us all, but many of you took time to

enjoy the Christmas Party at Lamar Savage's home. Our thanks to Lamar for his hospitality and home.

Mr. Brad Hughley and St. Bartholomew's Episcopal Church have invited us to be their guests for another concert on their new Rosales Organ. Diane Meredith Belcher will be the Guest Artist for that evening's performance. This is one of a series of recitals to mark the celebration of their long-awaited pipe organ. As January marks the beginning of a new year, their new organ marks the beginning of a new phase of their music program.

I hope that each of you will take time in January to set forth and explore your own options for the upcoming year. While many of us will make the traditional New Year's Resolutions, why not take a page of your calendar and write out some of the goals that you might use to challenge yourselves in 2004? It is a process we take seriously in our pipe organ shop. Setting goals-both short term and long term-will help guide and even simplify the day-to-day tasks. By setting goals in our own shop, we find it makes clear the short term needs and promotes necessary thought and planning for long term needs. Goal setting involves imagination and sometimes reality checks. Imagination and reality checks in their own right can be very frightening because they bring about their own set of "What if" questions.

The process of setting goals and achieving them does not come without work. The work will pay off in the accomplishments. However, do not let the work stifle the goal setting and visionary planning. Be reasonable with your goals and expectations. If you continue to find the resources cannot satisfy the possible goals, then consider changes in the resources. (What?!) Over the years, I have often found the successful choirs and organists are not those who focus on one particular type of music, but those who accept challenges and push for achievement. In the push you will be amazed at those who are willing to follow and assist with the achievement of goals at hand.

As you set goals for the year, take time to review the programs provided by the Guild. Our programs are planned to support and provide training and insight for our members. Sometimes we offer a performance by an artist so that we might enjoy and examine the timehonored compositions of the past combined with new music of the present. On other occasions, we gather to work with clinicians on the various details of our own playing in a Master Class. Other opportunities are presented through workshops or new compositions for choir and organ. And last but not least the importance of supporting our young musicians through our Pipe Organ Encounters.

2003 has been a very busy and rigorous year. I am indebted to those people who have worked with me to achieve goals for the past and set goals for the future. So if by the end of January someone were to ask what your direction and goals for 2004 are, what would your answer be?

Just So You'll Know

Not only was organist/baritone Trey Clegg singing with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra Chorus & Berlin Philharmonic for Benjamin Britten's "War Requiem" - he was presenting three organ recitals as well. His organ debut concerts in Germany were at the Franzosische Kirche (French Dom Church - 12/9) & St. Hedwig Cathedral (12/10), both in the former East Berlin. The third concert was held (12/13) at Martin Luther's 16th Century Reformation Castle Church, The SchlossKirche in Wittenburg. Works of Bach, Brahms, Chapman, Dupré, Mendlessohn and Liszt were among others performed in these historic venues. Soprano Arietha Lockhart also performed Mozart's "Alleluia" from Exultate Jubilate at the Wittenburg concert. Arrangements were made possible by Charles Redmon (also singing with the ASOC) who has maintained long friendships with the cantors of these churches and Dirk Hienze. German Culture Management of Weimar, Germany. Assisting as stop registrant with Charles was Trey's partner, Jim Hardin who were both kept very busy manipulating these tracker instruments! Commissioned Work for Eastertide

Krape is Organist/Choirmaster at Sacred Heart Church RC in Atlanta. He is also the longtime accompanist for the Young Singers of Callanwolde. Some of his compositions have been performed in the Atlanta area, and have been recorded.

Diane Meredith Belcher

In the forefront of American organists, Diane Meredith Belcher has performed throughout the United States for over twenty-five years, in addition to appearances in France and England. She made her solo recital debut at age 15, and received her degrees from The Curtis Institute of Music and The Eastman School of Music. She is a laureate of both the St. Albans (England) and Chartres (France) international organ competitions, and won the American Guild of Organists' top prize in its professional certification examinations. She was recently appointed Assistant Professor of Organ at Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey. She has performed regularly on the Wanamaker Grand Court Organ in Philadelphia, in duo-recital with trumpeter Rob Roy McGregor of the Los Angeles Philharmonic, and as soloist with numerous orchestras. In July 2002, she created a sensation performing the Jongen Symphonie Concertante with the Philadelphia Orchestra at the Girard College Chapel, receiving a thunderous standing ovation from the 2500+ members of the national AGO convention. A recipient of the 2000 Golden Ear Award for her premiere CD of the celebrated Glatter-Götz/Rosales organ in Claremont, California, her recordings are often broadcast on radio and television. including Public Radio International's Pipedreams.

Ms. Belcher has led numerous workshops and master classes, and is in demand as a competition juror, most recently at the Calgary International Organ Competition for 2002. She has been active as a church musician for nearly three decades, and was the founding director of the Memphis Concert Chorale. She is frequently asked to consult for church organ projects, and has commissioned and premiered several new organ compositions.

Laudatory reviews of her playing have appeared in such publications as *Clavier, The New Records, The American Organist, Organists' Review*, and *The Diapason, the* German journal *Orgel International*, and American Record Guide. She was named "Outstanding Keyboard Soloist of 1998" by the *Arkansas Times*.

Chenaults to Play Buzard Organ Dedication

Elizabeth and Raymond Chenault will play the Organ Dedicatory Recitals on the James G. Kenan Memorial Organ, built by John-Paul Buzard Pipe Organ Builders of Champaign, Illinois, February 16 & 17, 2004 at 7:30 PM. Opus 29 has four manuals, 63 stops, 87 ranks of pipes and 5,229 pipes with electric key and stop action. The concert will feature duet literature commissioned by and written for The Chenault Duo. The audience friendly program will include "Rhapsody" by Hakim, " Eclogue" by Shepard, "Allegro" by Moore, "The Emerald Isle" by Callahan, "Shenandoah" by White and the world premieres of "Rhapsody on Hymn Tunes of Ralph Vaughan Williams" by Callahan and Nicholas White's duet arrangement of Andrew Lloyd Webber's "Phantom." The concert will conclude with the Chenault's signature arrangement of Sousa's "Stars & Stripes Forever." Representatives from the Buzard Organ Builder Firm will be present for the Inaugural Concert as well as members of the Kenan Family who gave the organ in memory of their father, James G. Kenan. The Chenaults, who have been the Organists & Choirmasters of All Saints Church, Atlanta, since 1975, will play identical recitals on February 16 & 17. They are known as America's leading Duo Organists, have been featured at numerous AGO Conventions, record for Gothic Records and maintain an active concert career. They are managed by Phillip Truckenbrod Concert Artists. The concert is free and open to the public.




