An important keepsake from our centennial celebration will be the *Georgia/Atlanta Chapter Centennial History Book*. The book will be comprised of three sections:

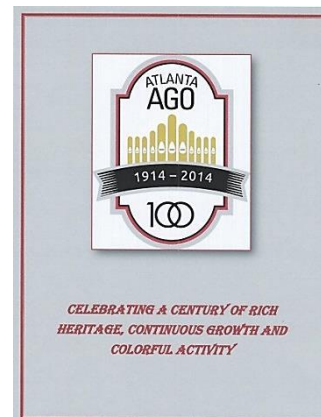
- Georgia/Atlanta Chapter History

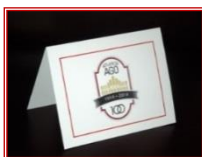

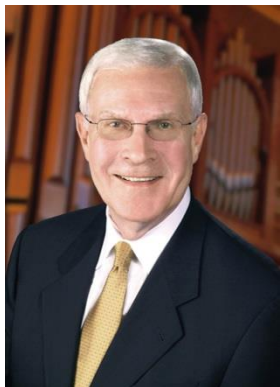

## Centennial Banquet – Monday, October 6, 2014

We will celebrate the organization of the Georgia Chapter of the American Guild of Organists with a gala evening on the exact date, one hundred years later. Atlanta First Presbyterian Church was chosen for this celebration because of its close association with the Georgia/Atlanta Chapter. Three of its former organists/directors have served as deans of the chapter: Dr. Charles A. Sheldon, Jr., AAGO (1921-23, 1932-34), Edith Howell Clark (1940-42, 1946-47), and The Rev. Herbert S. Archer, Jr. (1970-72).

The Black Tie Invited event will begin with Evening Prayer in Winship Chapel at 5:30, led by The Rev. Dr. Don E. Saliers, Our National Chaplain. Dr. Saliers is an American theologian specializing in homiletics and liturgics. He was the William R. Cannon Distinguished Professor of Theology and Worship at Emory University until his retirement in 2007. He received his B.A. from Ohio Wesleyan University, and both his B.D. (Bachelor of Divinity) and his Ph.D. from Yale University. An accomplished musician, theologian, and scholar of liturgics, and a United Methodist minister, Professor Saliers is the author of numerous books on the relationship between theology and worship practices. He co-authored *A Song to Sing, a Life to Live* with his daughter Emily Saliers, a member of the Indigo Girls. The Centennial Hymn, with text by former dean Michael Morgan, will be introduced at this service. If more than 70 people sign up for this service, hopefully, we will have to move to the sanctuary.



We will then gather for an hour of social time together on the terrace, with heavy *hors d'oeuvres* and sparkling wine (nonalcoholic). Former dean Gregory Colson will entertain us with his talents on the grand piano, and there will be a multi-media chapter history presentation with slides from the *Centennial History Book*. A seated dinner will follow in Fifield Hall, with special anniversary cake and dear friend of our chapter and former President of the AGO **Frederick Swann** as keynote speaker. It will surely be an affair to remember. Each member of the chapter will be receiving an invitation to this celebration with an RSVP return, designating entrée choice and attendance for Evening Prayer. For the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration in 1964, there were over 200 present. We are expecting a large turnout for this, so the earlier, the better. For those of you concerned about parking, there are 70 places behind the church, and there will be free parking, with security both in the garage and for crossing Peachtree Street.

# Chapter Scholarship Auditions 2014

Our Chapter held annual Scholarship Auditions on Friday, May 2, at Decatur First United Methodist Church. A big "thank you" to our colleague Mitch Weisiger for hosting this event. And thanks to our judges, Albert Ahlstrom, Gwen Bacon, and Melinda Clark, who judiciously awarded a total of \$6,700.00 in scholarship aid to 7 deserving players.

Vicki Ward Frey was awarded \$900.00 to pursue her organ studies with Dr. Tom Alderman, and to attend a summer organ workshop.

Timothy Jones, a student of Dr. Graham Purkerson, was awarded \$1,000 to be put toward tuition at Mercer University next year. Timothy has been accepted to study with Dr. Jack Mitchener.

Yifan Liang, a 9<sup>th</sup>-grader at Lakeside High School and a student of Dr. Jens Komdoerfer, will use his \$1,000 scholarship to attend a summer music camp/master class, and for further organ lessons with Dr. Komdoerfer.

Nathan Peace was awarded \$900 to continue organ lessons with Tom Alderman, and to purchase scores. Nathan is in 10<sup>th</sup> grade at Woodstock High School.


