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TAYLOR ORGAN COMPETITION

The Atlanta Chapter, AGO announces the establishment of the Taylor Scholarship Organ Competition, the first competition to be held Saturday, April 21, 2012 at St. Luke's Episcopal Church. Elizabeth Abbott Taylor, long-time member of the Atlanta Chapter, AGO, died in 2005 at the age of 101. She bequeathed a considerable sum of money to both the Atlanta Music Club and the Atlanta Chapter, AGO to be used for scholarships.

The Executive Board appointed a committee consisting of Sarah Hawbecker, Tim Wissler, Arlan Sunnarborg, Bobby Mays and Sarah Martin to determine the best use of this money. After many meetings over a period of two years the Taylor Scholarship Committee proposed to the Executive Board that a National Organ Competition be established, the first competition to be held on April 21, 2012, and then every three years thereafter. The proposal was accepted and the same committee was asked to draw up the rules for the competition. It is the belief of the Taylor Scholarship Committee that by opening the competition to students throughout the United States this will become a national and a lasting legacy to Elizabeth Abbott Taylor.




