Election results are IN! Thanks to each chapter member who voted. Numbers were the closest (among our 4 nominees) that David Barber can ever recall: Jonathan Easter and Melissa Casper Espy were elected Board Members-at-Large, Class of 2027! Tied for third with the exact same number of votes were nominees John Gentry and Leslie Boyette. This tie is significant, because Keith Wilson's un-expired Class of 2026 seat (he's no longer an AGO Member) was offered to either John or Leslie by the Executive Board, depending on who won third place in the election. I spoke with both Leslie and John, after which they had a conversation with one another. John Gentry graciously acknowledged that he served as a Board Member in the past, and will continue to help our Chapter in important ways. Leslie Boyette has accepted the two-year term available to make our Board complete! Warm Congratulations and sincere thanks to each of these enthusiastic members!

From the Chaplain

Dear Friends,

Take Time for Your Soul

Are you taking care of your soul?

I'm asking because I spent over 25 years as a professional soprano and teaching singing and various music classes before I became a priest. I even kept my musical skills going through seminary by singing in the Seminary Choir and also the Schola, but after ordination quickly got caught up in all the things that a priest does and essentially stopped doing anything music-related. Priests do very valuable things for other people's souls, of course, but I felt something was missing that needed to feed my own. Always a lover of classical music, I tried to fill that gap by continuing to listen to all my favorites. That wasn't enough. Slowly I'd let the musical part of me go... other than chanting the mass. Placing it off to the side, I thought maybe that was the end of that part of my life. After all, I'd had to resign my job and basically stop doing all of those things to be a priest. And then there was the issue of time... the one thing which, as a priest, I had so little of.

But what I found was that even though music wasn't my career anymore, I still needed it. I needed something musical in my life to feed my soul. I don't believe in coincidences, and when the Church of Our Saviour choir was invited to sing Compline with St. Bartholomew's Schola Cantorum, I was enchanted with that group and quickly asked if I could join them. I found exactly what I needed: a group that sang only twice a month (I could commit to that even as a busy parish rector) and that also sang really difficult music that would challenge me. It was something that the musically trained part of me needed... and the spirituality of the group combined with the breathtaking music was exactly what my soul didn't know it needed.

What does your soul need? Maybe it's time alone. Maybe a retreat or sacred space. Maybe it's season tickets to the opera or symphony. Maybe it's a musical group or offering outside of your normal job or gig. I can't tell you what it is, but don't wait to find it. You will be glad you took care of your soul.


