In 1995, David F. Oliver was appointed Organist/Artist in Residence at Morehouse College in Atlanta. Recently named as one of Colleges' "Institutions," David is now Director of Music Ministries at the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. International Chapel and Organist at the historic Ebenezer Baptist Church.

A native of Chattanooga, Tennessee, David is a member of the Warren Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church. His first organ teacher was Dr. J. James Greasby. Having completed his undergraduate studies at Wheaton College, Illinois, he received a master of music degree in organ performance from the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston. He also has done further organ study at Westminster Choir College, and the University of Kansas, in Lawrence. From 1984-1986 and 1989-1990, he was a doctoral candidate at the Eastman School of Music under the tutelage of the late renowned teacher Russell Saunders. David received the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Organ Performance from the University of South Carolina School of Music in 1999 where he was a student of Dr. William H. Bates. In 2000, Dr. Oliver was awarded a fellowship to study in the Master of Sacred Music program at Emory University with Dr. Timothy Albrecht.

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A MESSAGE FROM THE DEAN ~

Dear Colleagues,

Those of us who braved the cold, windy weather to attend our annual Student Recital on Saturday, February 11 at Covenant Presbyterian Church were treated to a delightful program. All ten performers did an outstanding job as they presented a variety of pieces ranging from Buxtehude to Daniel Gawthrop. Thanks to Brad Schultz for hosting and organizing this event.

We look forward to hearing chapter member Dr. David Oliver at the First Presbyterian Church of Atlanta on Tuesday evening, March 13. When we first approached Dr. Oliver about presenting a recital for our chapter, we had hoped to hear him perform on the 4 manual, 92 rank Wicks organ at Morehouse College where he serves as Organist/Artist in Residence. Unfortunately, the organ is not fully functional at the present time due to water damage from roof leaks. We thank Sue Mitchell-Wallace and Will Breytspraak for their willingness to host us. First Presbyterian Church houses two outstanding pipe organs: a 4 manual, 105 rank Zimmer organ in the sanctuary and a 2 manual Klop organ installed in the chapel in 2006. Dr. Oliver plans to utilize both instruments on March 13.

I am pleased to announce that a tour of historic Atlanta churches and their organs has been added to our March calendar. This is being presented by our chapter in conjunction with the Atlanta Preservation Center's *The Phoenix Flies* program, a city-wide celebration in March of each year that provides free access to historic sites integral to Atlanta's rich heritage. This event will take place on Sunday afternoon, March 18 beginning at 3:00 pm. It will begin at the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, continue at Central Presbyterian and end at Trinity United Methodist. Jeffrey McIntyre, Michael Morgan and Bruce Wynn will demonstrate the organs at their respective churches. The final instrument featured on the program, the Austin organ at Trinity United Methodist Church, is 100 years old this year. Parking for this event will be available in the Trinity UMC deck. I have also invited the Atlanta Preservation Center to join us for our regular March program at First Presbyterian Church featuring Dr. Oliver.

The annual Chapter Scholarship Auditions are just around the corner. This year's auditions will be held on Friday, April 27 at the First United Methodist Church of Decatur. The deadline for applications is April 13.

We continue to anticipate the first Taylor Organ Competition on April 21. The names of the five finalists have been announced; they represent such fine organ schools as Curtis, Eastman, Indiana, Juilliard and Oberlin. There is no doubt that we are in for an outstanding competition! If you are willing to serve as a volunteer at this event, contact Rachel Ficklin at 678-447-7228.

As I mentioned in my article last month, we will end the 2011-2012 season on May 20 with our annual Guild Service at St. Paul's Episcopal Church. A special feature of this year's service is the premier of a new anthem for organ and choir commissioned by the Atlanta Chapter and composed by Arlan Sunnarborg from St. Luke's Episcopal Church. Donations are still being accepted to help defray the cost of this project. Please contact Dan Pruitt if you would like to contribute.

In closing, I would like to give thanks for the life of Gerre Hancock, one of the true pillars of American church music. Dr. Hancock last performed for our chapter on October 19, 2008 when he improvised a symphony on submitted themes to conclude our portion of the "World's Largest Organ Concert." Our sympathy goes out to Judith and the members of the Hancock family. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

I look forward to seeing you at the First Presbyterian Church of Atlanta on March 13.

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Dr. Oliver has performed in the Lincoln and Kennedy Centers for the Performing Arts. His European performances have included Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris, Grossmünster in Zurich, the Maurice Ravel Auditorium in Lyons, France; and the Temple Church in London. His concert schedule in the United States has included recitals at historic St. Thomas Church and St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City, the Piccolo Spoleto Festival in Charleston, Trinity Church (Copley Square) in Boston, the Washington National Cathedral, and the University of the South. He has played concerts in the Cathedral of St. Philip, St Luke's Episcopal Church, Morehouse College, Emory University, and the historic Ebenezer Baptist and First Congregational Churches, all of which are in Atlanta. Other concerts have been at the College Church in Wheaton, Fourth Presbyterian Church in Chicago, and several chapters of the American Guild of Organists.

Dr. Oliver played five concerts during the Centennial Olympic Games 1996, in Atlanta. David played the Poulenc Organ Concerto with the University of South Carolina Chamber Orchestra in 1997. He is the first African-American organist invited to play on the Organ Concert Series at the Mormon Tabernacle in Salt Lake City. He has also performed at several national conventions of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Inc., and performed at the Fraternity's Centennial Convention in 2006. During the spring of 1998, Dr. Oliver played in several European cities including

Leipzig, Germany where he performed at St. Thomaskirche - the church where Johann Sebastian Bach composed many of his sacred organ and choral works. In June 2003, he played an organ concert in the internationally known Crystal Cathedral in Garden Grove, California and also in several cities throughout England.

As Director of Music and Associate Professor from 1990-1995 at Voorhees College in Denmark, South Carolina, Dr. Oliver was the recipient of the Sears Roebuck Teaching Excellence Award given to only 700 professors in higher education for excellence in teaching and contributions made to the school and community.

Dr. Oliver is affiliated with several organizations which include the following: the American Guild of Organists, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Inc., Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, and Outstanding Young Men of America. He is listed in Who's Who in American Education.

Dr. Oliver has made recordings at First [Scots] Presbyterian Church in Charleston, South Carolina (featured on the nationally syndicated weekly radio series "Pipedreams"), and the Martin Luther King Jr International Chapel at Morehouse College, which is also broadcast on PBS. Dr. Oliver was on the roster of the Young Organists Cooperative from 1994-1998, and from 2000-2004 under the management of the Concert Artists Cooperative.




