The Georgia Tech mixed choirs present their spring choral concert on **Sunday, April 23, 2006 at 4.00 PM** in a program titled "Musical Pairs." The concert will feature companion pieces- compatible musical selections programmed in tandem. Music will include selections from *Carmina Burana*, *The Sacred Harp*, music from the Renaissance, and a few "surprises."

The program will feature performances by the Chorale, Chamber Choir, and Glee Club, all under the direction of Dr. Jerry Ulrich, Director of Choral Activities at Georgia Tech. Choral groups at Georgia Tech represent both graduate and undergraduate students from all colleges across the academic spectrum.

The concert will be held at Saint Mark United Methodist Church at 781 Peachtree Street, NE, Atlanta Georgia, 30308. The church is two blocks directly east of Tech Square. Admission is free and open to the public.

2006 Atlanta Chapter Commissioned Work

"Reflections on the Passion of Christ According to the Gospel of Saint Mark," by David Kocsis, is the commissioned work for this year. The score was available at the February 17th meeting and will be again on March 14th. Additional copies will be available by request to Michael Morgan.

This impressionistic, introspective, and inspiring suite for organ is in four movements: Betrayal, Trial, Crucifixion, Resurrection. David is a very gifted composer, and this new suite promises to be a valuable and illuminating addition to the literature for this most significant season of the Christian year.

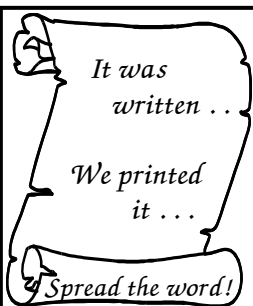

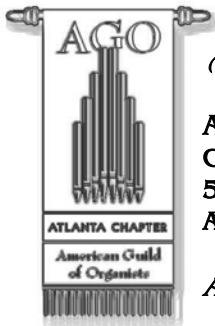

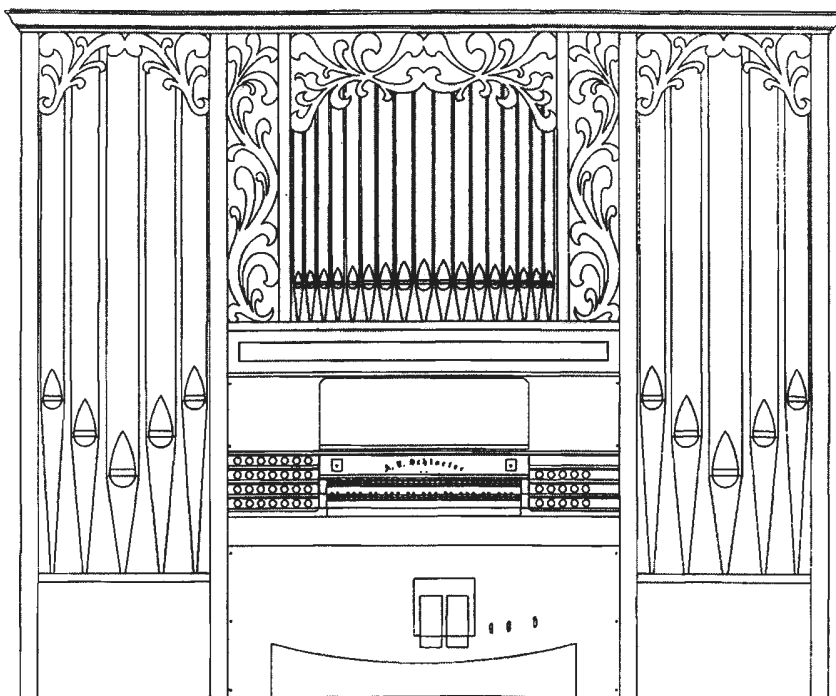
