From the Dean

Greetings, Atlanta Chapter!

I hope this finds you well and enjoying some early spring sunshine. I want to begin by thanking Vicki Fey for presenting a refreshing and creative program of hymn tune-based literature for Lent and Holy Week. Thanks also to the excellent video production by Mark Wallace Maguire and to Stephen Fey for his assistance. We are fortunate to have so many talented members in our chapter and I am grateful to everyone who has contributed to our first completely virtual season of programs.

As I mentioned in previous articles, it has been my hope that we would be able to offer our final two programs this season as in-person events in some form. However, with the ongoing state of the pandemic and the restrictions on gathering that have been imposed in many churches, we will not be able to do so.

Our April 10 Members' Recital will feature past chapter scholarship recipients and will be prerecorded and posted on the website at 10:00 a.m. that morning.

On May 1, we will gather virtually as a chapter for our Annual Meeting and Guild Service. The event will be held as a Zoom meeting and instructions for participating will be provided in the April newsletter.

We also have an election coming up for our Executive Committee! Many thanks to board members Tim Young and Jeff Daniel for their great work with the committee over the past three years. A mail-in ballot is included in this issue, along with biographical information on our new candidates. Our registrar, David Barber, is also in the process of setting up an online election which will run from April 1 through April 25. You will receive further instructions on how to vote electronically in the coming weeks. Or you may fill out the paper ballot on the front page of the newsletter and mail it to the address on the ballot.

Our Pandemic Assistance Grants have been gratefully received over the past year and, to date, we have provided almost \$5000 in total assistance to our members. I am pleased to announce that our Executive Committee voted to continue the program through May 2021, and the application form is included on page 3 of this newsletter.

One last important development I want to highlight is that our Chapter Scholarship Auditions are now scheduled for Saturday, June 26 at 9:00 a.m., and will take place at Smoke Rise Baptist Church in Stone Mountain. Atlanta Chapter Pandemic Assistance Grants

On August 1, 2020, the Executive Committee of AGO Atlanta approved a program of "Pandemic Assistance Grants" to be made available to chapter members who have been significantly financially impacted by the coronavirus pandemic.

Amount: One-time grants of \$750.00 are now being offered to individual members of the Atlanta Chapter.

Eligibility: Current chapter members who have been furloughed or laid off from any of the following: a salaried organist position, a regular per diem organist position, or freelance organist work, the sum of which is an important component of personal income.

Valerie Pool is the Director of Music and Organist at St. Benedict's Episcopal Church in Smyrna, where she directs the Parish Choir and coordinates all aspects of the music program, including the Children's Choirs and the recently re-formed Friends of Music recital series.

Valerie has been a member of

the music staff at Cincinnati Opera during their summer seasons since 2014, and is an alumna of The Atlanta Opera studio artist program. Other previous engagements include Tulsa Opera, the Wagner Society of Cincinnati, Opera Saratoga (New York), Cincinnati Chamber Opera, and Nashville Opera's Mary Ragland Young Artist Program.

A native of Marietta, Valerie completed her Artist Diploma in Opera Coaching at the Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music. She also holds a master's degree in Chamber Music and Accompanying from the University of Georgia and a bachelor's degree in Piano Performance from Kennesaw State University. She has extensive experience as an accompanist and organist in sacred music at a variety of churches, and loves collaborating with other musicians and artists. Valerie is honored and excited to have been nominated for the Board of the Atlanta chapter of the AGO!



Anthony Rimore has been working as a church organist since age 14 in Rochester, NY. He was matriculated at the Eastman School of Music as a Performance Major and due to a significant job opportunity at a young age (Director of Music at Sacred Heart Cathedral in Rochester, NY) ultimately finished his degree work at SUNY Brockport. Among his many

teachers, he counts both David Craighead and Timothy Albrecht. Anthony is a long-standing member of the Atlanta AGO, and concurrently with the New York City AGO and the Tallahassee AGO. He presently serves as the Newsletter Editor for the Tallahassee AGO. While pursuing a career in New York, his colleagues elected him to a lifelong membership in the prestigious St. Wilfrid's Club. Limited to just 85 members, The St. Wilfrid Club membership consists of those organists of recognized standing in the greater New York City and tri-state area. The object of the club is to promote social discourse among its members and to further the interests of organists. He also has a secondary career as Director of Marketing and Business Development for some of the most notable architecture firms in the (Arguitectonica, SOM [Freedom Tower] and HOK [Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta]). He pledges to bring a unique perspective to the Board, both as a performance musician and businessperson. His knowledge and meaningful participation in other AGO Chapters will aid in thoughtful and experienced suggestions and guidance to continue the work of the many talented Atlanta AGO predecessors in making the Atlanta Chapter as noteworthy, vital and enjoyable as possible.

Board Candidate Bios (cont.)

Keith H. Walker is the Director of Music Ministries at Northside Drive Baptist Church. In 2017, Keith was appointed as Music Director and Conductor of the DeKalb Choral Guild. Since 2014, he has served as Music Director of The Festival Singers of Atlanta. He is the current Repertoire and Resources Chair for Community Choirs for the Georgia Chapter of the American Choral Directors Association. He served on the faculty of Darton College where he taught applied voice and directed the college choir and vocal ensemble. For four seasons, he served as the Artistic Director for the Albany Chorale.

Keith holds a Doctor of Musical Arts in Conducting from the University of South Carolina, a Master of Music in Vocal Performance from the University of Missouri-Columbia, and Bachelor of Music in Vocal Performance from Augusta University. He has served as music director of churches in South Carolina, Georgia, and Missouri. He also holds a Bachelor of Science in Management from the Georgia Institute of Technology.

Keith's stage credits include Carmen and Friends, The Lovely Sounds of Christmas, A Hand of Bridge, The Old Maid and the Thief, The Medium, OKLAHOMA!, The Boy Friend, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, Die Fledermaus, Jonah, and Side by Side by Sondheim. He

has performed with Peach State Opera, Albany Symphony, Theatre Albany, Albany State University Opera Theater, Capitol City Opera, Muddy River Opera Co., Atlanta Lyric Theatre, and Galaxy Productions. In 2003, Keith went behind the scenes to make his debut as music director for Habima Theatre's production of *HONK!* He returned to Habima in 2004 to music direct their production of *The Music Man*. He has served as music director and conductor for the Darton Players' productions of *Babes in Arms*, *Godspell, The Gifts of the Magi*, and *Two Gentlemen of Verona*. Keith served as chorus master for productions of *Martha, Don Giovanni*, and *The Tender Land* with Opera at USC.

Keith's oratorio credits include Eleanor Daley's Requiem, Durufle's Requiem, Handel's Messiah and Solomon, Mozart's Coronation Mass and Requiem, Haydn's The Creation and Mass in B-flat major "Theresienmesse", Faure's Requiem, Schubert's Mass in G, and Vaughan Williams' Fantasia on Christmas Carols. Keith has sung with the Atlanta Symphony Chorus and The Festival Singers of Atlanta. He sings seasonally with Like the Dickens Carolers.


Online Sunday Afternoon Recitals at the Cathedral of St. Philip


