

## NEWS RELEASE

In the true spirit of Psalms 98 and 150, Living Grace Lutheran Church will host Jazz Vespers on Sunday, March 27, 2011, at 5:00 p.m. All are welcome to attend this service. There is no admission charge, but a freewill offering will be gratefully received. The offering will benefit the scholarship fund of the Atlanta Chapter of the American Guild of Organists in memory of a long-time member, Dr. Robert F. Wolfersteig.

Vespers is late afternoon or early evening prayer. One of the nine "daily offices" of the Benedictine monasteries, vespers celebrates the lighting of the lamps as evening descends. By incorporating jazz music into the sung and played prayer, Living Grace will follow in the long tradition of Jazz Vespers — a mix of poetry, prayer, and live jazz — known in New York, Toronto, Seattle, Vancouver, San Francisco, Philadelphia, Jacksonville (FL), and elsewhere. Many well-known jazz composers have written sacred music, including Duke Ellington, Dave Brubeck, and Joe Williams. These services also adapt secular music to spiritual ends.

Theologian Patricia Bays preached the following in a sermon at a Jazz Vespers service: "As we listen to this wonderful music, some of it written down and ordered, some of it improvised and spontaneous, it occurs to me that improvisation can be an interesting metaphor for the spiritual life — a life lived both in ordered patterns and in spontaneous response to changing circumstances and events. For change is always part of our lives"

Vespers is a social gathering, probably a descendant of the ancient lighting of fires at the onset of darkness. It is a way we gather together and, at a shifting time of day, reflect. The great jazz pianist Bill Evans aptly called jazz "a social situation," a gathering of musicians to create and contemplate the entity we call jazz. Jazz and vespers, by their natures, call for us to be open and receptive, so it is natural for the two to be joined, as they are in this service, to help, unsettle and soothe us. There is no teaching in a jazz vespers—only listening and, perhaps, learning.

Poetry is, in its ancient meaning, a making and the poets are the makers. It is spoken but it is a different language that we use everyday. It has been described as the saying of what cannot be said. Clearly, poetry finds a natural place to say its unspeakable truth in the fluid and thoughtful place that is a jazz vespers.

In the service at Living Grace, the jazz messengers will be Kathy Tugman and the David Walters Trio, all veterans of the style. Also, organist Philip Newton will join pianist David Walters for a special instrumental selection, the last composition he played with his teacher, Dr. Wolfersteig, at their joint concert at Living Grace in 2009. David Tugman will read poetry selections.

Kathy Tugman and the David Walters Trio have been one of Chattanooga's premier jazz groups for over seven years. The group has a monthly stint at the Chattanoogan Hotel, frequently appears at other sophisticated supper venues and is a favorite at private affairs. It has participated in several jazz vesper services, to uniform praise. Kathy, who has sung with the Chattanooga Symphony, has seven albums to her credit, fronts a pop band and directs the handbell choir at St. Timothy's Episcopal Church on Signal Mountain, Tennessee. David, who received his undergraduate and graduate degrees in music from the University of Cincinnati, is a professor of classical and jazz piano at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga and is on the faculty of Cadek Conservatory. The rhythm section, of Gordy Nichol on bass and Jo Whitaker on drums, is an accomplished and veteran unit, having performed with David since the early 1990s. Together, Kathy and the Trio bring a refined jazz sensibility and a strong spiritual sense to vespers.
