The April issue of *The American Organist* finds one of Atlanta's POE 2004 grads smiling out from page 72. Parker Ramsay, age 14, is pictured with Wilma Jensen, with whom he began organ study in September 2003. Page 74 introduces 10-year-old COMPOSER Karen E. Christianson, who studies organ with Alan Morrison in Philadelphia, where she's an AGO Chapter Member! This month's obituaries include that of Lorraine G. Johnson, age 84, a lifelong organist who finally completed her college degree at the age of 61, and who continued to play the organ for more than 4 churches until October 2004. Although I never met or heard of Ms. Johnson before reading her short bio on page 77, her life provides an inspiring example for us of continuing education in music. In Fall 2005, a 64-year-old clergyman with a PhD. took his first piano lesson from me. Being part of musical progress and communication is a joy and a privilege! Soon after this edition of *The Organizer* is mailed, we will know the results of our April 28th Chapter Scholarship Auditions.

Howard Giles Dunlap, (whose obituary was published in the AJC on 4/1/06), died on March 19th as the result of a head injury. Howard & Mary Katherine, dedicated Members of our Chapter who married 57 years ago, have 5 children and 8 grandchildren! For over 50 years, Howard was Organist at First Church of Christ, Scientist,

Decatur. Dr. Dunlap was a gifted and highly-lauded English teacher at the high school and college levels (Emory and Clark-Atlanta Universities), and became Executive Director of Curriculum Services for the Fulton County School System. Howard's retirement years found him teaching an annual Honors English Class, and coordinating the LEAP program to help students catch up in their academics. A CELEBRATION of Howard Dunlap's life will be held near the time of his September 22nd birthday. This information should appear in the September issue of the Organizer. Next John Mansaeu and saxist Mike Bastedo played Paul Halley's "Winter's Dream". Albert Ahlstrom, John & Nancy Edison, Tim Shepard, and David Kocsis ("Crucifixion" from *Relections on the Passion*) played original compositions, and Carol Dallas, Tim Young, John Coble, Michael Collier, and Brad Hughley rounded out the program with works by Steven Quesnel, Alan Hovhaness, Curtis Bryant, Sigfrid Karg-Elert, and William Schuman. WOW! I was glad to have as my guest, Becky (Mrs. Will) Rogers. She and I thoroughly enjoyed the music, as well as the hospitality of Ed Schneider and Dr. Calvert Johnson.
