May Chapter Meeting

Kenneth Miller serves as Assistant Professor of Church Music at the School of Theology of the University of the South in Sewanee, TN. There, he heads the busiest Episcopal seminary music program in the nation, teaching classes, conducting multiple choirs, and supervising ten sung chapel services each week. Before moving to Sewanee, he worked as associate organist and choirmaster at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Columbia, SC, and as instructor of organ at the University of South Carolina. He served on the Cathedral of St. Philip's music staff from 2013 to 2014. He holds degrees from Lenoir-Rhyne University, where he studied with Florence Jowers and Paul Weber, and the Yale School of Music and Institute of Sacred Music, where he studied with Martin Jean and Thomas Murray. Dr. Miller will perform:

William Christopher Wells, 1932-2022



Mr. William Christopher Wells, 89, of Tyrone, died Sunday, March 20, 2022, at Southland Health & Rehab in Peachtree City. Born April 4, 1932, in Vidette, GA, he was a son of the late Herman Wells and the late Dora Lucille Tankersley Wells. Mr. Wells was a graduate of Furman University and worked as a music minister for his entire career. He served several area churches, including Cascade Baptist Church, First Baptist Church of Jonesboro, before finishing his career at Shadnor First Baptist Church in Union City. Mr. Wells was a member of the Atlanta Choral Society and had sung all over the world.

Survivors include his brother, Marion F. Wells (Patsy) of Tyrone; nephews, Ty Crowe, and Herman Wells, Jr.; and several great nieces and great nephews. The family will hold a private service at Eastside Cemetery in Statesboro, GA, at a later date.

He studied piano with Henrietta Counts.



Keith C. Wilson has spent nearly 30 years as a music director, instructor, pianist, organist, and vocalist, creating wonderful music around the world. He has been continuously noted for his strong conviction to bringing a high quality of contemporary and standard music to his audiences. He received his formal training at Georgia

State University in Voice performance. His background in classical, theater, gospel, and spirituals has set him in the forefront of the music community. He was chosen to coordinate and conduct a 5000-

He was chosen to coordinate and conduct a 5000voice choir for the 1996 Paralympics Games Opening Ceremonies. On behalf of the City of Atlanta/Bureau of Cultural Affairs, Keith conducted the Atlanta Super Choir, performing on several European tours representing the city. Keith is very proud of his work as music coordinator on the featured film *The Gospel*. working with such greats as Yolanda Adams, Kirk Franklin, Fred Hammond, and Donnie McClurkin. He has served as Minister of Music and Worship Arts for several local churches in Atlanta, GA. Keith has made a commitment to designing and implementing organized, creative, and intelligible programs that help build the knowledge and skills of Christians in the performing arts. He is the proprietor of 14W Music, dedicated to the instruction of private & classroom voice and piano. Keith has worked in theater for such productions as, Black Nativity, The Amen Corner, One Mo' Time, Zion, Theatre of the Star's Purlie, starring Melba Moore, Robert Guillaume, Sherman Hemsley. He also toured Europe with the opera Porgy and Bess. Keith has recently founded The New Philharmonic Concert Chorale, an ensemble of 36 professional singers with a refreshing and distinct expressiveness that performs a wide variety of music genres.



British-born **Carol Williams** is a child prodigy nurtured in a Welsh musical family. She could read music before English, private lessons began at age five, and performed organ recitals chauffeured around by her father starting at eight years old.

Her formal training was at the Royal Academy of Music in London where Carol specialized in organ performance under David Sanger. Obtained the Academy's Recital Diploma and IRAMs in organ and piano. Williams became a Fellow of the Royal College of Organists, a Fellow of Trinity College London, and Associate of the Royal College of Music. She

commuted from the UK for a year to study with Daniel Roth at the Church of St Sulpice, Paris.

In the United States, Carol undertook postgraduate study at Yale University with Thomas Murray and awarded Artist Diploma along with the Charles Ives Prize for outstanding achievement.

Carol's doctoral studies were completed at the Manhattan School of Music in NYC, where she studied under McNeil Robinson Dr. Carol holds Civic Organist "Emerita" of San Diego, a position she held from 2001-2017 and continues to perform internationally, casting a wide stylistic net to entice new audiences to the concert organ. She is known for her collaborations with jazz, blues, and rock bands, as well as leading orchestras as BBC Orchestra, San Diego Symphony, and Beijing Symphony Orchestra to name a few.

Dr. Carol Williams, elected Associate of the Royal Academy of Music in recognition of her contribution to the field of music, is one of the world's most popular concert organists and top classical artists that brings a new experience to the typical solo Organ concert with her unique registrations, elegance and exceptional charismatic personality. Williams delivers a divers musical experience from heavy classical to theatrical, popular and jazz organ.

As a featured musician on many media platforms, she highlights her profound love for the "King of Instruments." Carol hosts "TourBus" a documentary series exploring the large and small, famous and unique pipe organs of the world and also, hosts a YouTube talk show series called "On The Bench with Dr. Carol" where she interviews musical artists. She currently serves as the Artist in Residence at Peachtree Christian Church in Atlanta and Artistic Director of Viscount North America. Learn more about Dr. Carol at her home page: melcot.com

Unusually, we have only two members-at-large standing for election to the Board this year, so they will automatically be elected, along with our candidate for Sub-Dean.

Amendment to the Atlanta Chapter Procedures

The following paragraph in the Chapter Procedures:

OFFICERS: The Officers of the Atlanta Chapter shall be seven in number: Dean, Sub-Dean, Secretary, Treasurer, Registrar, Newsletter Editor, and Auditor. They shall be elected annually by ballot from the Voting Members of the Chapter for a one-year term; their term in office begins July 1st each year. It is customary that Chapter Officers are re-elected for a second term, but they shall not serve more than two consecutive terms (Treasurer, Auditor, Newsletter Editor, and Registrar excepted). Usually if the Dean is a man, the Sub-Dean is a woman, or vice versa; this pattern is recommended, but not mandatory. Six members of the Chapter shall serve on the Executive Committee divided into classes of two each by year of election; their term of office is three years, two people being elected each year and two rotating off. An Honorary Chaplain may be appointed at the discretion of the Dean. The Executive Committee shall consist of the Officers, the elected Members-at Large, and the immediate past Dean, who shall serve one year beyond Deanship. It is customary for an at-large member to be off the Executive Committee for one year before being eligible for re-election. Officer, Board, and Chairperson assignments may change and/or be reassigned by the Dean as the skills and availability of the persons changed are considered.

shall be amended as follows:

OFFICERS: The Officers of the Atlanta Chapter shall be seven in number: Dean, Sub-Dean, Secretary, Treasurer, Registrar, Newsletter Editor, and Auditor. They shall be elected annually by ballot from the Voting Members of the Chapter for a one-year term; their term in office begins July 1st each year. It is customary that Chapter Officers are re-elected for a second term, but they shall not serve more than two consecutive terms (Newsletter Editor excepted). To provide continuity, the Treasurer and Auditor may be re-elected but shall not serve more than four consecutive terms. Following the fourth term, the Treasurer and Auditor shall not be eligible for re-election for a period of two years. Every endeavor shall be made to ensure the membership of the Executive Committee reflects the diversity of the Atlanta Chapter. Six members of the Chapter shall serve on the Executive Committee divided into classes of two each by year of election; their term of office is three years, two people being elected each year and two rotating off. An Honorary Chaplain may be appointed at the discretion of the Dean. The Executive Committee shall consist of the Officers, the elected Members-at Large, and the immediate past Dean, who shall serve one year beyond Deanship. It is customary for an at-large member to be off the Executive Committee for one vear before being eligible for re-election. Officer, Board, and Chairperson assignments may change and/or be reassigned by the Dean as the skills and availability of the persons changed are considered.



AVAILABLE PIPE ORGAN: Our Opus 1 (1998) is a three-manual/29-rank rebuild and enlargement of a two-manual organ installed in St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, Bridgeton, NJ originally built in (1909) by C.S. Haskell, who previously had been foreman of Hilborne Roosevelt's Philadelphia shop.

St. Andrew's recently merged with two other parishes, and its historic building has been sold. The organ is now in storage on our premises and is available for installation in a new home for \$200,000–350,000, depending on particulars. Its sound and stoplist are strongly reminiscent of American organs from the period of 1880–1915 as heard in instruments by such builders as Hook, Roosevelt, and their contemporaries. Indeed, two-thirds of its pipework dates from those years. It has five 16′ ranks, five reed ranks (including a Hook & Hastings Bell Clarinet dating from 1881), as well as four wooden flute ranks plus three metal flutes. Fourteen of the metal flue ranks are slotted. The action is electro-mechanical, and is equipped with a state-of-the-art control system.


