Atlanta native Jonathan Biggers studied with Russell Saunders (Eastman School of Music, DMA), Lionel Rogg (Conservatory of Music, Geneva Switzerland, Fulbright study); J. Warren Hutton (The University of Alabama, MM and BMus), and Wallace Zimmerman (Atlanta, pre-college); he has also worked extensively with Harold Vogel (Bremen, Germany) and with Arthur Poister (former Professor of Organ at Syracuse University).

Jonathan holds the Edwin Link Endowed Professorship in Organ and Harpsichord at Binghamton University (State University of New York).

The evening will pay tribute to the late John Widener, a long-time member of the Atlanta Chapter, for his unique ability to make it possible for many organists to make beautiful music on the instruments that he maintained many of which he also installed.

#### An open letter from Jonathan Biggers to the Atlanta Chapter:

My concert on May 12 is dedicated to all of the members of the Atlanta Chapter of the American Guild of Organists and in sincere thanks for all of the support and numerous kindnesses that the chapter has shown me since 1972: awarding me first place in the Atlanta Chapter Scholarship Competition and for the many return engagements that continue to bring me delight in performing for such a wonderful and accomplished group of musicians. If there had to be one AGO chapter that provides the "marquee," it would certainly be the Atlanta Chapter, with its unique programming, continued sponsoring of new events and workshops on varied professional topics, and a driving dedication toward furthering the cause of the organ. These are but a few of the reasons this chapter is special. Its large and varied membership certainly runs the gamut of musicians in every way, and the close friendships I have had with so many chapter members brings me great delight in every way.

It is a special pleasure that I was asked to perform the closing program for the Atlanta Chapter's year-long centennial celebration on the Schantz-Widener organ at Grace United Methodist Church, an instrument made so special by Sue Goddard. Sue was an iconic figure in my formative years, inspiring me through her many fine concerts on this magnificent instrument. Her concerts were among my favorite events to attend prior to entering college. I am continually touched by how thoughtful and wonderful she is and by her superb artistry and dedication to the cause of organ and church music, which is demonstrated unfailingly during her nearly six decades of service, not only to Grace, but also to the Atlanta community. As well, John Widener and Tommy McCook have tended to this instrument since its installation, and the final revision of the organ serves as John's final testimony to his art. Both John and Tommy were/are friends of mine, and it is with sincere pleasure that I recognize their dedicated service to the Atlanta community by their tending to the maintenance of many organs in Atlanta, including those built by the Schantz Organ Company.

Lastly, I would like to recognize my close friend and first organ teacher, Wallace Zimmerman, who has faithfully supported the Atlanta Chapter for many years. Without Wally, I would not have been inspired to become an organist. His dedication to his craft and continued faith in me, both as a student and as a close personal friend, has never ceased to amaze me, and I feel most fortunate to have had such a wonderful person in my life over these years. Equally, I have been most inspired by the generous and kind support of the entire Atlanta Chapter over these many years, and for that I am most grateful.


