# From the Dean

Dear Friends.

As I write this letter, many people in southern Georgia, northern Florida and other areas of the Southeast are still suffering from the aftermath of Hurricane Michael. Please join me in offering our thoughts and prayers to all those impacted by this devastating storm.

Many of you are already aware of the death of longtime Atlanta AGO member, David Stills. Since some of you only get AGO news through the printed version of this newsletter, I would like to reprint here an email announcement I sent to the membership regarding David:

The Atlanta chapter of the AGO sends our condolences and deepest sympathy to the family of David Crawford Stills. As many of you know, David was a prominent Atlanta musician for many years. He served as Dean of our chapter and held many important posts in the city: Director of Music at Ebenezer Baptist Church; Associate Organist/Choirmaster at the Cathedral of St. Philip; Minister of Music at Warren Memorial United Methodist Church; adjunct Professor of Organ at Georgia State University; College Organist at Morehouse College; Sales Associate at Chapel Music Co.; and Consultant for the Schlueter Pipe Organ Co. He also was a teacher in the Atlanta public school system. In addition, he was the organist for the funeral of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Joyce Johnson provided vital information about David's varied and impressive career. I would like to thank Joyce, Don Land and all those who informed me of David's passing. He will be remembered fondly by so many of you, and he leaves a great legacy as a performer, teacher, church musician and friend.

A celebration of David's life was held October 12 at Ebenezer Baptist Church. May he rest in peace.

Our next meeting will be Saturday, November 3, in historic Covington, GA. I would like to thank Alice Walker and Becky Ramsey for planning such a delightful day for us. I hope many of you will come out to support your colleagues who will play in the two members' recitals. In addition to enjoying a delicious meal, you will have the opportunity to tour some of the historic homes in Covington. This is going to be a wonderful event!

November begins with All Saints' Day, a time when we remember those who have gone before us. Many of you will be busy the following Sunday, November 4, with special services in the morning and afternoon. I wish you well in your preparations. Near the end of the month, we pause to offer thanks for all of our many blessings. I am grateful for family and friends and for all of you for your membership and support of the AGO. As you ponder the gifts of the world around you, consider the words of Folliott S. Pierpoint: "For the beauty of the earth, for the glory of the skies, for the love which from our birth over and around us lies, Lord of all, to thee we raise this our hymn of grateful praise."
