Quimby Organ, Dunwoody UMC

The pipework for Dunwoody UMC's Quimby organ originates from two instruments the church purchased a few years ago with the intention to build a grand organ. It combines prior work of two of the world's master builders, E.M. Skinner and Casavant Frères. In those pipes are some of the most beautiful colors—Skinner's hallmark—and very impressive English-style principal pipes ever built by the French-Canadian builder Casavant.

Almost all of the pipes are under expression, so that many sounds can be played in a dynamic range from delicately soft to powerfully grand. This organ specializes in warmth and variety, with sounds that envelop, and encourage singing. It will do so for generations to come.


