

Wilma Jensen

Wilma Hoyle Jensen retired from St. George's Episcopal Church, Nashville, Tennessee, in May 2002 after nineteen years as Organist/Choirmaster. Before her tenure at St. George's, she served the First Presbyterian Church of Oklahoma City for fourteen years. A renowned organist, she has toured extensively throughout the United States and Europe. Ms. Jensen received her Bachelor's and Master's Degrees from the Eastman School of Music, studying organ with Catharine Crozier and Harold Gleason. At Eastman she received the Performer's Certificate in Organ. She received an Honorary

Doctorate from Piedmont College, Demorest, GA. She has served on the faculties of Indiana University, Bloomington; the Scarritt Graduate School, Nashville; Oklahoma City University, Oklahoma City; and the Blair School of Music of Vanderbilt University, teaching Organ and Church music. She has made two organ CD recordings on the Casavant organ at St George's: *Mors et Resurrectio* (Arkay), and *Sketches and Improvisations* (Pro Organo).

Ms. Jensen will play a recital at St. Luke's Episcopal Church on Friday night, and will conduct a master class at the Roswell Presbyterian Church on Saturday morning.



Don't miss the same-day MEGA-SALE of used organ literature, music books, and vintage vinyl recordings available for you to purchase at bargain prices before/after the class, and during the Break (when a few snacks will be available). Jeff Harbin has kept for us more than he has room to store!

I received the following October 6th message from Janet E. Dawson, President of the Atlanta Music Club (their 90th Anniversary is NEXT year!): "On behalf of the Board of Directors of the Atlanta Music Club and members we extend our heartiest congratulations to you and the members of the Atlanta Chapter of the American Guild of Organists on your 90th anniversary and sincerest wishes for the coming ninety!" I was also delighted to receive a complimentary copy of David Stills' recently published composition, 5 Variations on CHESTER (a tune by William Billings which I first heard sung at Old Sturbridge Village in Massachusetts), premiered in Atlanta by the composer on October 17th.

Since the cost per page of 'snail-mailed' hard copies of

this newsletter had more than doubled, Betty Williford and I wondered if perhaps our 3 AGO Members (Gregory Colson, Gregg Bunn, Carolyn Scott) at Northside Drive Baptist Church might be able to help us out on a monthly basis - the answer is "Yes!" Thanks to Carolyn Scott, Church Secretary, for making the copies for this month's Organizer, and to the church for the use of their equipment (which includes an efficient folding machine).

I hardly know what to say to you if you weren't able to be with us at All Saints on October 12th - You were MISSED. It seemed just the right place to be on that special occasion, a sentiment echoed by our gracious hosts, Ray & Beth Chenault, and Pamela Ingram who 'went the extra mile' to make the evening unforgettable. The 90th Anniversary cake artfully decorated with our Chapter logo, tasted even better than it looked! Elegant dinner invitations sent by Party Planner Dan Pruitt to our 22 surviving Past Deans. resulted in 19 being present (and photo'd) - so I should have called a special meeting after the concert, on Dean survivalship! A commemorative booklet included everything from the elegant menu to a concise History of the Atlanta Chapter. As I listened to amusing and priceless memories shared by Dan Pruitt, Ray Martin, Adele McKee, John Widener, and Bill Weaver, I realized that this celebratory sharing of recollections and possibilities should continue each month of this year - AND be preserved in writing! What a CONCERT on top of all this - David Briggs (who was once mistaken for Elvis Presley's keyboard player) loving every minute of thrilling his audience. right to the fluid improvisation with which he ended such a colorful evening. I went home, still hearing the virtuosic sounds of voices on the wind, illuminated by new knowledge about our Chapter's history, and filled with high hopes for our future.

Perhaps most significant of all was October 12th's display of archives on loan from the Atlanta History Center, thanks to the persistence of both Dan Pruitt and our faithful Chapter Historian, Don Robinson. I doubt if ANYONE paging through these fascinating

scrapbooks was satisfied with the amount of time we had to see them. You and I need to follow up with a visit to AHC! Let's take a half a day sometime, and include a prospective AGO member, to see more of the tangible evidence of this our local music history being carefully preserved not far away.

What WILL the future hold? I believe great opportunity lies in each one's ability to visualize the pipe organ's unique contribution; in the generosity to acknowledge & encourage the talents of our fellow members; in wise and courageous use of funds available for scholarships & commissioning of new music; and through exemplary professional treatment of one another
