Sewell Organ

Housed in the Piedmont College Chapel, the Sewell Organ is named in honor of Piedmont alumnus and former trustee Charles K. Sewell ('54). Designed by Dr. James F. Mellichamp, President of the college, in collaboration with members of the Casavant staff, the organ contains 3,691 pipes, constructed of various metals and woods. The organ's mechanical key action joins with a solid-state electronic combination action, which controls the organ's stops and couplers. The organ case, constructed of oak, features hand-carved and gilded pipe shades.



Mark Pacoe

Mark Pacoe has performed as soloist and accompanist domestically and abroad. As prizewinner from the Oundle International Young Organists' Academy in Great Britain, Mark made his European solo debut tour at St. Paul's Cathedral (London), Chichester Cathedral, and St. Mary's Cathedral (Edinburgh Fringe Festival). In November 2014, Mr. Pacoe launched the premiere edition of the Terra Sancta Organ Festival in the Holy Land with solo recitals in Israel and Palestine at Basilica of the Annunciation (Nazareth), St. Saviour Monastery (Jerusalem) and St. Catherine Church/Nativity (Bethlehem/Palestine). Other career highlights include the Basilica of St. John the Baptist and Canton Palace Theater (Canton, OH),



St. Mark's Episcopal (Berkeley, CA), Artisten (Göteborg, Sweden) St. Peter's Basilica (Vatican City), the Cathedral of St. Patrick (New York), the Poulenc *Concerto for Organ, Strings and Tympani* with members of the Naples Philharmonic (Florida), St. Paul's Cathedral (Pittsburgh), Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels (Los Angeles), Princeton Chapel, "Voices in the House International Music Festival" concerts at Sydney Opera House and Sydney Town Hall (2007 and 2011), "Perform in Harmony with Olympic Spirit" at Forbidden City Concert Hall in Beijing, the Oriental Arts Center in Shanghai (2008) for the XXIX Olympiad, and at Vienna's Peterskirche and Konzerthaus as featured soloist for the International Haydn Festival (2009). Other engagements have included The Connecticut Choral Society (Danbury), The Montgomery (Alabama) AGO chapter recital series, the 14th International Organ Festival in Amsterdam (Oude Kerk), Koepelkerk (Purmerend, Netherlands) and Hooglandse Kerk (Leiden, Netherlands), Broadway Baptist Church (Ft. Worth, Texas) AGO, 'Celebrity Organ Recital Series' at the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart (Houston), 'Stop-In Series' at Holy Trinity (NYC), 'Pipes at One' Trinity Wall Street/St. Paul's Chapel (NYC), 'Concerts at St. Malachy's' (NYC), Duomo San Maria del Fiori (Florence), San Francesco (Pistoia, Italy), 8th International Organ Festival in Arona (Italy), 22nd International Organ Festival in Sens (France), Cathedral of St. John (Milwaukee), St. Maclou (Rouen), La Madeleine (Paris), National City Christian Church (Washington, DC), Heinz Chapel (Pittsburgh), and Trinity Church (Boston).

Mr. Pacoe earned degrees from Duquesne University (Pennsylvania), and East Carolina University (North Carolina), and did post-graduate studies at the Eastman School of Music, University of Rochester, NY. His primary teachers have included Ronald Gould, Ronald Doiron, Janette Fishell and David Higgs. Mr. Pacoe serves on the Executive Board of the NYC Chapter of the American Guild of Organists and is also a member of the National Association of Pastoral Musicians. Mr. Pacoe has been on the artist roster of EastWest Organists since 2013. He has published several articles on sacred music in the *GIA Quarterly* (Gregorian Institute of America), Fall 1996, Summer 2003 and Fall 2003 and *Word on Worship*, the Newsletter of the Office of Divine Worship of the Archdiocese of Newark in Spring 2006. Mr. Pacoe is in demand as an adjudicator for organ competitions including the 1st Concours International d'Orgue in Saint-Julien-du-Sault (Yonne, France, 2013), 2nd Concorso Internazionale Di Interpretazione Organistica "Agati-Tronci" (Pistoia, Italy, 2013), George Markey Scholarship (Metro New Jersey Chapter AGO), AGO Region I RCYO Competition (2011), the John Rodland Scholarship (2012) and also served on the faculty for the AGO Pipe Organ Encounter in Wilmington, Delaware.

Mr. Pacoe currently serves on the American Guild of Organists New York City Chapter Executive Board and is Director of Music and Organist at the recently formed parish of St. John Nepomucene, St. John Martyr and St. Frances Xavier Cabrini in Manhattan and Roosevelt Island. Mr. Pacoe had served as Director of Music for St. Malachy's Church - The Actors' Chapel and was also Artistic Director of the acclaimed Concerts at St. Malachy's series and led the music program to become known as one of the finest all-volunteer ministries in Manhattan. In 2013, Cardinal Dolan appointed Mark to a six-member music commission for the Archdiocese of New York for which Mr. Pacoe's term has been renewed through 2017. Mr. Pacoe spearheaded the acquisition and installation of the vintage Aeolian-Skinner, Opus 938 (1935) / Peragallo (2012) Paul Creston Memorial Pipe Organ in 2012. Mr. Pacoe's debut recording, *Crossroads – Music from St. Malachy's – The Actors' Chapel, Times Square*, was released in October 2015. Fauré Requiem

Duruflé Requiem

On Sunday, November 6 at 4:00 p.m., the Cathedral of St. Philip will offer its annual service of Choral Requiem Eucharist in memory of Cathedral members, friends, and family who have died during the past year. Music will feature Maurice Duruflé's *Requiem*, sung as the music for the liturgy. Dale Adelmann will lead the Cathedral Choir and orchestra, with Patrick A. Scott and David Fishburn at the organ.

Remembering Robert Shaw


Few artists have given more to the world and their own community than the great and greatly beloved Robert Shaw. On Sunday, November 20, from 3:00 to 5:30 p.m., a tribute to the lasting legacy of Mr. Shaw will be held at the Rich Auditorium of the Woodruff Arts Center. The program features a lecture by Robert Blocker, Dean of the Yale School of Music and editor of *The Robert Shaw Reader*, a collection of the famous letters of the conductor to members of the various choruses he led—including the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra Chorus—that has become an invaluable reference for those who would seek to know the man and his music. The lecture will be followed by a discussion moderated by Dean Blocker with a number of leaders from the Atlanta musical community who knew and worked closely with the legendary maestro.

Barbara Lister-Sink at Mercer University

The Townsend School of Music at Mercer University will host Barbara Lister-Sink, internationally-acclaimed pianist and pedagogue, for a recital on Friday, November 18, at 7:30 p.m. in Neva Langley Fickling Hall in the McCorkle Music Building on the main Mercer campus in Macon, GA. The recital will include works of Chopin and Scriabin as well as the *Variations sérieuses* of Mendelssohn and Maurice Ravel's monumental work, *Gaspard de la nuit*.

Dr. Lister-Sink is one of the world's leading experts in the field of injury-preventive keyboard technique. Students and professional pianists from around the globe have retrained with Lister-Sink in order to recover from playing-related injuries. All keyboardists will have the opportunity to learn basic concepts regarding a natural and free technique in a workshop entitled "Developing a Well-Coordinated, Injury-Preventive Keyboard Technique" on Saturday, November 19, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The recital and workshop are both free and open to the public; however, interested pianists and organists who wish to attend the workshop on Saturday are asked to make a reservation by emailing Leighanne Hise at hise_la@mercer.edu or calling 478-301-2748.
