Sandra Soderlund is primarily an organist although she also performs on harpsichord and both modern and early piano. She displayed a passion for music at an early age. She began formal piano study at age five and organ lessons at twelve. Her first major organ recital took place at the First Presbyterian Church of Oakland when she was sixteen. She went to Bethany College in Lindsborg, Kansas, and while there studied piano and music theory with Herbert Bielawa, a young professor from Chicago. They

were married soon after her graduation and went to the University of Southern California for graduate study. Sandra earned her Master of Music degree in organ performance and Herb his Doctor of Musical Arts degree in composition. Sandra returned to graduate study and earned a Doctor of Musical Arts Degree from Stanford University. Her dissertation, published by Hinshaw Music, Inc., as Organ Technique: An Historical Approach, was a standard text for many years.

Sandra Soderlund has taught at several colleges in the San Francisco Area and was a visiting professor at Stanford University and the University of Colorado. She presently teaches harpsichord at Mills College in Oakland. She has also served as organist and music director in many churches. - continued on page 4 -



Sandra Soderlund's concert career has led to performances all over the USA and in Holland, Germany, France, and Korea. She was the first American to play on the New Podium for Contemporary Music at the Haarlem Organ Festival in Holland. She has played many historic instruments and is known for her imaginative and eclectic programming. She plays harpsichord, clavichord, and both modern and early piano in addition to the organ. She has recorded for Arkay and Albany Records.

Dr. Soderlund has edited several scholarly editions of keyboard works and written guides to the pipe organ for children and adults. She has also written articles for The American Organist, Diapason, and Clavier. She serves on the editorial board for the Early Keyboard Journal. Her book How Did They Play? How Did They Teach? A History of Keyboard Technique was recently published by Hinshaw Music, Inc. She also published A Young Person's Guide to the Pipe Organ. Her workshops on various aspects of keyboard performance have been well received on college and university campuses as well as at meetings and conventions of the American Guild of Organists and the Music Teachers National Association.

AGO Chaplain elected trustee of Epworth Old Rectory

SPECIAL TO THE ADVOCATE

Want to get rid of your preacher? Burn down the parsonage! So was the thinking of the vestry of St. Andrew's (Anglican) Church in Epworth, England, in 1709 when The Reverend Samuel Wesley was rector. Fortunately for us, Samuel, Susannah and all 10 of the Wesley children, including 1-year-old Charles and 5-year-old John (the "brand plucked from the burning"), were rescued.

Apparently reconciliation was reached between pastor and parish, a new rectory was constructed and Samuel remained rector until his death in 1735.

The rectory was purchased by the World Methodist Council from the Church of England in 1954 and opened as a world heritage museum in 1957. Now, for the first time in its storied history, the Epworth Old Rectory is undergoing an historical restoration to the Queen Anne period of 1716, when Samuel and Susannah Wesley (mostly Susannah) were raising their remarkable children.

At the 2011 meeting of the World Methodist Council in Durban, South Africa, John Beyers, senior minister of Conyers First United Methodist Church, was elected and appointed an international trustee representing the whole of the World Methodist family. He is charged with raising awareness of the Wesley's treasured home, developing financial support and overseeing the \$2.65-million restoration project.

Beyers, who has a deep passion for Wesleyan history and theology and world evangelism, teaches in the North Georgia Conference License to


