International concert organist, recording artist, choral conductor and lecturer, Dr. **Gail Archer** regularly draws attention to composer anniversaries or musical themes with her annual recital series in New York City. Past years have included An American Idyll, Liszt, Bach, Mendelssohn and Messiaen. In spring 2013, the five-concert series was "The Muses Voice: A Celebration of International Women Composers." Dr. Archer was the first American woman to play the complete works of Olivier Messiaen for the centennial of the composer's birth in 2008; *Time-Out New York* recognized the Messiaen cycle as "Best of 2008" in Classical music and opera.

Her recordings include *The Muse's Voice*; *Franz Liszt: A Hungarian Rhapsody*; *Bach, the Transcendent Genius*; *An American Idyll*; and *A Mystic In the Making* on Meyer-Media LLC; and *The Orpheus of Amsterdam: Sweelinck and his Pupils* on CALA Records, London. She is the founder of Musforum (www.musforum.org), an international network for women organists to promote and affirm their work. Archer is college organist at Vassar College, and director of the music program at Barnard College, Columbia University, where she conducts the Barnard-Columbia Chorus. She serves as director of the artist and young organ artist recitals at historic Central Synagogue, New York City. She has performed widely in the United States and Europe.

Chenaults Celebrate 40th Anniversary at All Saints'

The Atlanta Chapter delights in acknowledging this splendid milestone in the lives of our colleagues, Ray and Beth Chenault. Their beautiful spirit in music-making has been a gift to this community, as well as nationally and internationally. Ray and Beth began working at All Saints' Episcopal Church on October 1, 1975. Their time at All Saints' has seen expansion of the concert series to include musical theatre, opera, chamber music, and national and international concert organists—recitals fully funded by patrons and ticket sales.


They inspired and oversaw the installation of the John-Paul Buzard pipe organ, which included the premiere of *Requiem 2003* by David Briggs.

Ray and Beth's choirs have sung for numerous conventions including ACDA, AAM, AGO, and Choristers' Guild. They have performed at Carnegie Hall, the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, Washington National Cathedral and Piccolo Spoleto. The All Saints' choir has made several recordings and commissioned more than twenty-five choral anthems and Requiems.

They have worked with three Rectors and many other priest associates. They have mentored hundreds of choristers, several of whom are enjoying successful music careers. They have taught more than 8,000 choristers during their 31-year tenure as Choral Directors and Director of Fine Arts at The Lovett School.

As duo concert organists on the roster of Truckenbrod Concert Artists, they have played thousands of recitals in the U.S. and Europe, and have been featured at many regional and national AGO Conventions. They have recorded four organ duet CDs on the Gothic Record label, commissioned and premiered more than fifty organ duets, and have published music under the Chenault Organ Duet Library of Warner Brothers Publishers. MorningStar Publishers is preparing to publish The Chanault Organ Duet Series.

We applaud and congratulate Beth and Ray on these marvelous and highly esteemed accomplishments. They strive to perform all styles of music at the highest quality, to lead by example, to treat people with love and respect, and to mentor and inspire young people and support them in their careers. What wonderful blessings they are to our profession and our community, as well as to colleagues far and wide, to future musicians and posterity. We applaud them and wish them many more magnificent years of music-making and sharing.
