

University Organist Timothy Albrecht Launches the "Year of the Jaeckel"

Timothy Albrecht, Emory's University Organist, has kicked off Emory's season-long celebration of Emory's new 14-ton Jaeckel Opus 45, 3-manual, 54-stop mechanical action pipe organ with a free concert. 
