Stephen Pinel will provide a slide presentation which surveys the genesis, history, holdings, organization, and reference services they offer, with a particular emphasis on how the members of the Atlanta AGO Chapter might use this resource for their use. The collection was founded in 1961, and has grown steadily since. It is currently in its third location at Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey. Stephen Pinel has been the Archivist since 1984.

## A MESSAGE FROM THE DEAN

### *Taking Advantage of Learning Opportunities*

Our September program featured the music of Robert Hebble and a special treat was having him on hand for the evening. Listening to his recollections was like being transported back in time – wasn't it great? Through the years I've acquired several of his collections of compositions and it was terrific to learn more about them and to hear some of them as we were able to do.

My interactions with Hebble date back for some time actually. About 20 years ago I was trying to track down an arrangement of a piece on an LP record by Virgil Fox (remember those?). The publisher informed me that the piece was out of print and a search of numerous music stores around the country for a dusty score proved fruitless. In sheer desperation, and knowing that he had been Fox's assistant, I got an address for Bob Hebble and wrote to him. Swifter than a speeding bullet came his reply along with a photocopy of Virgil's score for the piece – including registration indications!

The moral of this story, for me, was to always be willing to take advantage of every resource you can find. And so I encourage all of you to avail yourselves of a great opportunity at our October 21 meeting to hear from Stephen Pinel, the keeper of the American Organ Archives. This is one of the best kept secrets in the organ world and a marvelous resource for all of us to use. I look forward to seeing you at Agnes-Scott College for the program – and remember it's on the third Tuesday of the month!

Don't forget to also avail yourselves of the Organ Spectacular Weekend events which are mentioned in this newsletter. There is the interactive Concert for Kids of All Ages on Saturday, October 18, at 10 a.m. at Peachtree Road United Methodist Church. On Sunday, October 19, at 3 p.m. the Organ Spectacular concert will be held at Redeemer Lutheran Church. Come one, come all – bring someone with you to share the excitement!

Teachers of piano, strings, voice and organ take notice. A rare opportunity to hear a wide selection of Olivier Messiaen's music is coming on **October 31, November 1 and 2, 2008**. Groups of students are especially encouraged to attend.

The Cathedral of St. Philip would like to invite everyone to a three day Messiaen Fest that begins Friday, October 31 at 7:30pm in Child Hall. Our Messiaen celebration will open with pianist Paul Kim performing selections from "*Vingt Regards sur L'Enfant-Jesus*" and other works for piano by Olivier Messiaen. Mr. Kim has recorded the complete piano music of Messiaen.

On Saturday, November 1, 2008 at 7:30pm in the Cathedral, the celebration will continue with the chamber music masterpiece "*The Quartet for the End of Time*" performed by the Inman Piano Trio. This accomplished ensemble consists of pianist Brent Runnels, violinist Beth Newdome and cellist David Temko. Messiaen's song cycle "*Chants de terre et de ciel*" will be sung by soprano, Wanda Yang Temko.

On Sunday, November 2, 2008 at 4:00pm in the Cathedral there will be Readings and Music for All-Saints-tide. The Cathedral Schola will sing Messiaen's "*O Sacrum Convivium*" and other anthems between movements of "*Les Corps Glorieux*" for organ. Jared Johnson will be the organist.

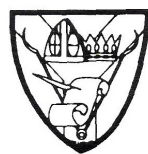
### *Driving Directions to Agnes Scott*

**From the West:** drive east on Ponce de Leon; stay in the right hand lane. At the west entrance to Decatur, take the right fork onto West Ponce de Leon (NOT angling slightly toward the north onto Scott Boulevard). Stay in the right hand lane, which will force you to turn right onto Trinity Place. Several blocks later turn right South McDonough. Cross the railroad tracks and go another block. Turn right into the college's parking deck.

**From the North:** drive south on Clairmont. Turn right on Commerce. When Commerce dead-ends at Howard, turn left. A long block later turn right on South McDonough, crossing the railroad tracks. Go another block and turn right into the college's parking deck.

**From the East:** Come to Decatur by US 78 from Stone Mountain. Get into one of the two left lanes which will merge with Lawrenceville Highway. After the second light, get into one of the two left lanes which will merge with Church Street. Take Church Street through downtown Decatur until it dead-ends at the railroad tracks, and go one more block. Turn right into the college's parking deck.

**From the South:** Take I-285 to the Covington Hwy exit. Go west on Covington Highway through Avondale Estates where the road changes name to Avondale Road and then College Avenue as you approach the city limits of Decatur. You will pass Agnes Scott College on your left, but turn left on South McDonough (the west side of the campus). Turn right into the college's parking deck after one block.

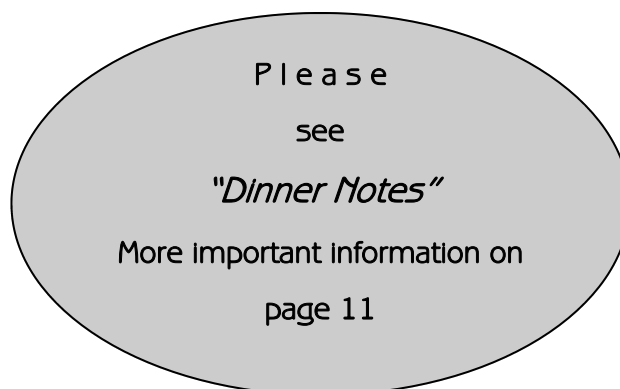

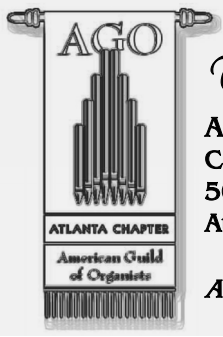
