During the first year, the Georgia Chapter had a total membership of thirty-three, including one fellow and one associate. Annual AGO dues were \$3.00 and a church dinner cost 50 cents.

In the early years, prominent Atlanta churches provided details of their service music for the Saturday evening church pages of the *Atlanta Journal*.

In 1919, a motion was made and carried that "a fine of twenty-five cents be made for members not attending meetings." Has this motion been rescinded?

Marcel Dupré gave a recital at Presser Hall on the Agnes Scott campus in 1948.

David Briggs

Acclaimed as one of the foremost concert organists of his generation, David Briggs enjoys a busy touring schedule. He has built a considerable reputation as an exciting performer and communicator, with particular emphases on orchestral transcriptions and the art of improvisation.

He studied improvisation with Jean Langlais in Paris; transcribed many of the recorded improvisations of Pierre Cochereau, won the Paisley International Improvisation Competition; became the first British winner of the coveted Tournemire Prize at the St Albans International Improvisation Competition, and now teaches improvisation at the Royal Northern College of Music, the Royal Academy of Music and Oxford University.

He is Organist Emeritus of Gloucester Cathedral. He held similar positions at Truro and Hereford Cathedrals and at King's College, Cambridge, where he was Organ Scholar. He was Principal Viola in the National Youth Orchestra of Great Britain, playing under conductors such as Sir Simon Rattle, Sir Charles Groves, Charles Dutoit, and Kiril Kondrashin, and was awarded their Bulgin Medal for Musical Excellence. He obtained his FRCO at the age of seventeen, winning all the prizes and the Silver Medal of the Worshipful Company of Musicians. While at Gloucester, he oversaw the complete rebuilding of the Cathedral organ by Nicholson, and directed the Three Choirs Festivals on three occasions, conducting some of the UK's finest professional orchestras, notably the Philharmonia.

David Briggs is increasingly in demand as a composer. Recent works include his a setting of the Solemn Requiem Mass for All Saint's Episcopal Church, Atlanta, Georgia.

His schedule for 2003 included some fifty concerts - in the USA (four trips), UK, France, Belgium and South Africa - and in July he was a member of the jury for the St Albans International Organ Competition. When not pursuing musical activities, David Briggs continues work towards receiving his private airplane pilot's license.



CHESTER Variations


