The young artist is a senior at Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey, where he is studying organ performance with Ken Cowan. Stephen serves as Organ Scholar at Trinity Episcopal Church, Princeton, and as Director of Music for the Episcopal Church at Princeton University. He has been appointed Senior Organ Scholar for

Wells Cathedral in England, beginning in September 2010. In addition to his church work, Stephen keeps an active recital schedule, performing at St. Mary the Virgin, St. Bart's, and St. John the Divine in New York City; the American Institute of Organbuilder's convention in Columbus, Ohio, and at many other venues across the country. This year he recorded his first solo CD for Delos Records on his father's recent installation in Bloomington, Illinois. His proud father will be traveling to Atlanta for Stephen's recital. 


