As the winner of the Grand Prix d'Interprétation at the 24th Concours International d'Orgue de Chartres, Dexter Kennedy has established internationally as "one of the greatest organists of our times" (Iceland Monitor). Praised for his "prodigious technique and grand style musicality" in *The American* Organist, his concert programs present performances that are fiery, spontaneous, and historically informed, exciting both music connoisseurs as well as people who have never experienced the organ in concert setting. In addition to concertizing, Dexter Kennedy currently serves on the music faculty of the College of Wooster as Instructor of Organ and Harpsichord. During the Fall 2017 semester, Kennedy is Guest Organ Teacher in Residence at Oberlin College and Conservatory.



Mr. Kennedy is an active recitalist throughout both Europe and North America, having performed in great cathedrals, churches, and concert halls including: Berliner Dom; St. Bavokerk, Haarlem; Slovak Philharmonic Hall, Bratislava; Chartres Cathedral; Grossmünster, Zürich; Chichester Cathedral; Hallgrimskirkja, Reykjavik; Basilica of St. Nazaire, Carcassone; Narbonne Cathedral; Auditorio Manuel de Falla, Granada; San Luigi Dei Francesi, Rome; St. Willibrordus Basilika, Echternach, Luxembourg; and Bergen Cathedral. His performances have been heard at the St. Albans International Organ Festival, the 51st Bratislava Music Festival, the Bergen International Organ Festival, the Conference of Roman Catholic Cathedral Musicians, and two regional conventions of the American Guild of Organists. Kennedy's 2017-2018 season will see him perform at Notre-Dame de Paris, the Eccles Organ Festival (Salt Lake City), the Arizona Bach Festival, and recitals for the Atlanta, Southern Nevada, and Houston Chapters of the American Guild of Organists.

Dexter Kennedy holds the Artist Diploma from the Oberlin Conservatory of Music, where he was a pupil of James David Christie. He holds a Master of Music Degree from the Yale School of Music and Institute of Sacred Music, where he was a recipient of the Robert Baker Award, as well as the Mary Baker Prize for Excellence in Organ Accompaniment. Kennedy has also studied under Olivier Latry, Martin Jean, Jeffrey Brillhart (improvisation), Arthur Haas and Webb Wiggins (harpsichord), and has attended several international organ festivals where he has coached with many distinguished European artists. In his spare time, he enjoys golfing and vigorously rooting for the professional sports teams in his native Detroit.

Dexter Kennedy is represented by Seven Eight Artists.

She is remembered for her gracious spirit and delightful dinner conversations at AGO dinners. The funeral service for Irma was held at Lutheran Church of the Ascension on Saturday, August 5. Ken Boone, formerly organist at John Knox Presbyterian Church, Northside Drive Baptist Church, and most recently serving as organist at First Church of Christ, Scientist, Atlanta, passed away on Thursday, September 7, following an illness. Ken served as Chaplain of the Atlanta Chapter during the tenure of Dean Joanne Cobb-Brown. Ken was a talented musician, decorator, and floral arranger. The memorial service for Ken was held at Northside Drive Baptist Church on Saturday, September 16. Our sincere condolences are with those loved ones who survive our dear colleagues.

As we pick up the pieces of the recent storm and look for healing in the loss of friends, we are reminded that God is sovereign and His plans and purposes are unfolding in the span of His love and care. We move forward "in grace alone." Directions to All Saints'

All Saints' is located on the block bordered by West Peachtree St., Ponce de Leon Ave., Spring St., and North Ave.

From the Interstate:

On I-75/I-85 going north, take exit 249D (North Ave.), cross Spring Street, then turn left onto West Peachtree. Stay in the left lane; cross North Avenue and turn left into the parking lot (just past the church and on the corner at Ponce de Leon Ave.).

On 1-75/I-85 going south, take exit 249D (North Ave.), then turn left at the traffic light onto North Ave. Go through the light at Spring St. and turn left onto West Peachtree, then turn left into the parking lot (just past the church and on the corner at Ponce de Leon Ave.).

From within the city:

Spring St. (on the west side of the church) is one-way south; West Peachtree (on the east side) is one-way north; Ponce de Leon (on the north side) and North Ave. (on the south side) are both two-way streets.


