It's a way that God has been speaking to me for most of my life.

I exhort you to think about that, and think about the special type of evangelism you offer. It may be someone's salvation in a way that (as much as I love a good sermon) a "regular" sermon can't do.

LOST and FOUND and...

The energy we put into something lost is usually focused. And the joy we have once we find it can be overwhelming in all the best ways. The joy we have once we have found it can then quickly fade because we have it—and we can get lulled into taking it for granted. I suppose it depends on the value we place on that "thing."

What if that missing thing is our Atlanta chapter? I still consider myself relatively new. And in my short time, I have wondered: where is everyone? We have over 350 members and we rarely see more than 10%-20% at any given function. I know we are all busy and sometimes the break from what we do, and are inundated with, is a welcome relief.

This all came rushing at me when I talked with Adele McKee, FAGO. The history at our one lunch was enough for a book. I was re-energized about our chapter. And now I find myself asking: how can we get *you* involved in ways that matter to *you*?

We need help...

- 1) Building Out the Pipe Organ Directory: Do you have time to travel around the state and take photos of different organs at various locations? Play them so we have an audio file of the instrument? If that interests you, we need help building out the directory.
- 2) Programming: Our chapter has traditionally had the subdeans plan the programming. I enjoyed doing this with Dr. Caroline Robinson. However, when I was at SMU in Dallas, I served on Dallas' programming committee. They helped guide what the chapter might enjoy. Last year we focused on the Orgelbüchlein; this year is improvisation; next year is organ music for pianists (limited pedals). I enjoy programming but so do others. If you enjoy doing that and have good ideas...we need your creativity.
- 3) Website: It's not going to be perfect. We are looking for ways to make things better and ensure things stay current. We have a bunch of easy functionality and control over the website. If you're "techy" enough to do simple clicks and choose what is needed at any given time, what things might need tweaking (we have a company to do that work), then we need you on this committee.
- 4) Hospitality: Do you enjoy making people feel welcomed? Hopefully, we all do. Our hospitality has been really lacking at events and left mainly to the same two or three people. That gets exhausting. We need help.
- 5) Financial Planning/Giving: The Adele McKee Fund is merely one starting point. I know we have fundraising and financial experts in our midst. Have we talked with our members about bequests, estate planning, etc.? Some of you may be gifted in this. Let's help create a powerful legacy for our chapter.

This is simply me making an "I feel" statement: It feels like we need to find "us" again. The excitement that made us who we are was because of the mighty shoulders we still stand on—like the Adele McKees of our chapter. Standing on shoulders is very different from walking forward on those shoulders. I had a lot of questions in this article because...I don't have the answers.

What I do know is that we need help making us better. What we don't want is the website being a mere flash-in-the-pan of excitement and then we're back to an old routine. Maybe there's an area you really enjoy doing related to the organ. I'm confident your skill or excitement about the organ fits in somewhere with our chapter. Let me know what that is, and we'll help you find your way in being part of us. We all have something to contribute for the good of us all. I don't want to turn this into an *Amazing Grace* line, but let's move on from lost and found to, more importantly, moving forward...


Organist Thomas Bara at St. Luke's Episcopal Church
