The Atlanta AGO chapter makes a rare trip to a church in the southern part of the area for its first meeting of the 2004-2005 season.

Following dinner, we will participate in a service based on Evening Prayer of the 1662 English Prayer Book, led by The Reverend Ruth T. Healey, Priest Associate. The Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis will be from the C Major Service by D.V. Stanford. The Anthem will be "King of Glory, King of Peace" by Gerald Near. The choir is directed by Jon Marc Rutherford, assisted by Dock Anderson and

Choristers from Woodward Academy. Our chapter chaplain, The Rev. Ken Boone, and The Rev. Charles Roper, Retired Canon to the Ordinary, Episcopal Diocese of Atlanta, will assist with the service.

The current church building was built in 1950. A 4-rank Moller was installed in the original building in 1947. Through the years new and used ranks have been added, bringing the total to 24 ranks. The current 3manual Moller console was acquired from Atlanta's All Saints Episcopal Church when the recently-replaced Schantz instrument was installed there.


