

Season Opener

On Tuesday evening, September 12, we will celebrate with Grace United Methodist Church and organist Sue Goddard the completion of the Schantz organ by Dr. Thomas McCook of Widener and Company. In addition to a total of 101 ranks, the church has undergone considerable acoustic enhancement, and few organists can demonstrate the instrument as skillfully as Dr. Frederick Hohman, who will be the featured recitalist.

Active as a touring organ virtuoso since 1984, Dr. Hohman has appeared widely as guest recitalist, and has collaborated with organists and choirs in over 150 Pro Organo CD recordings. He has hosted over two dozen episodes of the "Midnight Pipes" television/home video series.

A native of St. Louis, he holds academic degrees through the DMA, along with a Performer's Certificate, from the Eastman School of Music. In 1984 he won first prize in both the Arthur Poister Organ Competition, as well as the National Organ Playing Competition (Mader Foundation, Pasadena, (CA).

In light of the recent terrorist threats, Dr. Hohman has canceled most of his airline travel in the immediate future, but has graciously agreed to drive to Atlanta to play for us!

The program for the evening is well-chosen for its artist and this instrument. Transcriptions and embellishments are by Lamare and Hohman.

A Message from The DEAN

Happy New Year!

It is my hope that you will mark your calendars early, since not all meetings will be on a second Tuesday, and plan to enjoy fellowship with your colleagues, good food, and a delightful and varied season.

One change being instituted this year is the cancellation of standing dinner reservations for the entire program year. Because of the increasing number of no-shows, and the difficulty in collecting for those reservations, the Board has opted to require reservations for each meeting.

Thanks to the hard work of your Registrar, Michael Morris, and newsletter editor Charles Redmon, the 2006-2007 Yearbooks will be ready for you to pick up at the September meeting. ATLANTA'S PREMIERE EARLY MUSIC ENSEMBLE PLANS FIVE PROJECTS FOR 2006-2007 SEASON

On Saturday, 2nd of September 2006 at 8 pm, *New Trinity Baroque*, Atlanta's leading early music ensemble and orchestra on period instruments, will open its 8th concert season, with a GALA CONCERT celebrating Mozart's 250th Anniversary. The opening concert of the season will celebrate one of the greatest composers who ever lived, and at the same will mark the beginning of NTB's five programs concert season, gathered around the theme "Music of Great Composers."

The concert will be presented at St. Bartholomew's Episcopal Church, 1790 LaVista Rd NE, Atlanta, GA 30329. St. Bartholomew's has already become a well known concert venue in Atlanta, especially for chamber music. Because of its exquisite acoustics which compliments the archaic sound of period instruments, the church has become a regular venue for New Trinity Baroque concerts.

This year's main series will offer five exciting programs, each one celebrating the music of one great composer. The September 2nd concert celebrates music by W.A. Mozart, in a program entitled "Mozart Birthday Bash." Patrons will have the opportunity to enjoy his most beautiful compositions, including "Eine kleine Nachtmusik", Salzburg Symphonies No. 1 and No. 3, and his Church Sonatas (for organ and strings). The orchestra, performing on period instruments of the time, will be conducted by maestro Predrag Gosta, New Trinity Baroque's founder and artistic director.

Following the September project, the other four concerts of the season will feature music by G.F. Handel (October 21), J.S. Bach (December 23), A. Vivaldi (February 24) and C. Monteverdi (April 21).

Five Prestigious Awards Bestowed


The national office of The American Guild of Organists in New York City has bestowed five awards of national distinction at its Annual Meeting on Monday, July 3, at the Rockefeller Memorial Chapel. AGO President Frederick Swann presided over the awards ceremony.

The AGO President's Award was presented to PLEASANT R. ROWLAND, found of the American Girl Doll Company, philanthropist, and donor of the Overture Concert Organ in Madison, Wisconsin. The prestigious award is presented biennially to recognize outstanding contributions to the art of the organ in the United States. The 2006 award was presented "In gratitude for her generous patronage of the King of Instruments, particularly her gift of the Overture Concert Organ, expanding the musical horizons of that community and beyond."

The AGO Edward A. Hansen Award was presented to D. DEWITT WASSON. Created by the AGO National Council in 1999 to honor the memory of the Guild's distinguished past president, Edward A. Hansen, the prestigious award is presented biennially to recognize individuals who have demonstrated outstanding leadership in the AGO.

The AGO Distinguished Composer Award was presented to RICHARD PROULX. This award is also presented biennially to recognize outstanding composers of organ and choral music in the United States. The prize winning music was "The Day of Pentecost," and anthem for SATB choir and organ based on texts from Act 2:1-4, and "Six Sketches on Children's Hymns," a nine-minute suite based upon six hymn tunes. Each award includes a \$2,000 cash prize, publications of the winning composition, and a performance at an AGO National Convention.

The AGO is pleased to announce results of its 2005-2006 Membership Grants and Awards Program. Established in 2004, the program was created to assist and reward AGO chapters for recruitment, significant increases in voting membership and retention of programs. Grant recipients were announced as follows: Nashville (TN) Chapter; Southern Indiana Chapter; York (PA) Chapter; Cape Cod and the Islands (MA) Chapter; Denver (CO) Chapter; Orange County (CA) Chapter; Salisbury (MD) Chapter; Singapore Chapter; Tidewater (FL) Chapter. 
